NOTICE WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

Effective midnight, Monday, March 7, 1966, all paved roads in the Province of Prince Edward Island, except Trans Canada Highway from Borden to Charlottetown and Charlottetown to Vernon Bridge on Route 1, and from Albany Corner to Summerside on Route 1A are closed to all vehicles whose loaded weight exceeds 4,000 lbs. gross per axle.

When the temperature drops to 20° above zero or colder, during the night time, vehicles are permitted to carry up to registered weight between 5 a.m. and 10 a.m. of the same day.

This notice is issued under authority of regulations published November 30, 1965.

NOTE: Vehicles travelling on Trans-Canada Highway, from Borden to Vernon Bridge, and from Albany to Summerside, are permitted to carry up to registered weight. There will be no tolerance allowed over 18,000 lbs. gross per axle, or 32,000 lbs. gross per tandem axle.

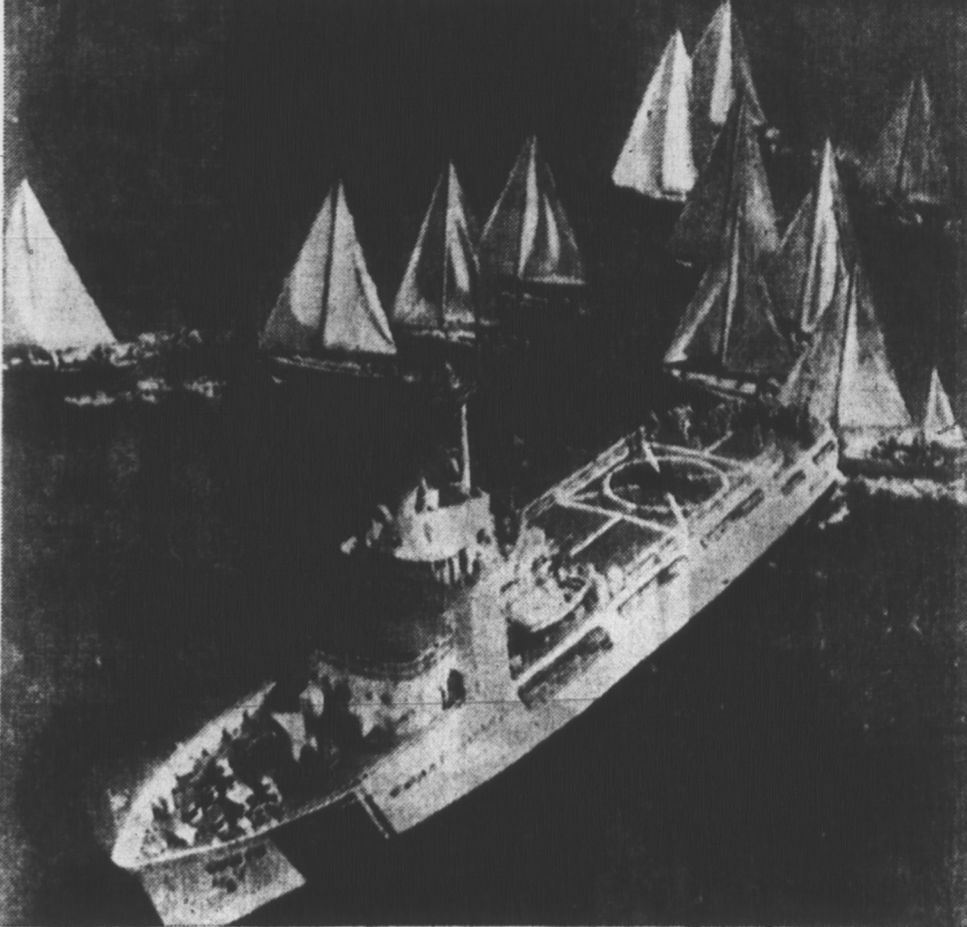

Nova Scotia Planning Board Has Report Tabled In House

By DAVE NICHOLSON HALIFAX (CP) - The first plan of the Nova Scotia voluntary planning board, tabled in the legislature here, gives strong support to the development of specific industrial centres as the best way to cure the province's economic ills. The report says these "growth centres" are needed to attract secondary industry, which in turn is the main hope of dealing with high unemployment and lagging capital investment. The report identifies the Halifax-Dartmouth and Sydney-Glace Bay areas as the spots that must be immediately developed. But other areas in the province, such as Truro, Amherst and a part of Pictou County could become secondary centres, with emphasis on services and resources rather than industry.

Economics Minister G. I. Smith, who tabled the report, indicated that government intends to act on at least some of the recommendations. He told the house the report contains "the principles and policies that we must follow if we wish to achieve a faster rate of growth and more rapidly to improve our standard of living. . . if the plan is not acted upon, then of course it is of little value."

The board, comprising business, labor and government representatives, was established by the provincial government in 1963 and its first report is the combined work of more than 2,000 people. The chairman is A. R. Harrington 51, president and general manager of Nova Scotia Light and Power Co. Ltd.

PLAN LINK WITH SEA LUSAKA, Zambia (AP)—The Italian Fiat motor firm and the Zambian government are to set up a \$5,000,000 (\$15,000,000) transport organization in a bid to cut down Zambia's dependence on Rhodesia's vital routes to the coast, it was announced Tuesday. President Kenneth Kaunda said when he opened parliament here that the organization would form the nucleus of a transport network linking land-locked Zambia with the sea.

Studebaker Prospects Not Bright

OTTAWA (CP) - Industry Minister Drury said Tuesday discussions have been held with Studebaker about keeping its Hamilton automaking plant in operation but this possibility seems unlikely.

Mr. Drury was replying to questions in the Commons for the second straight day on the Studebaker shutdown announced Friday. Answering New Democrat Leader Douglas, Mr. Drury said his department is making a canvas to find another use for the plant.

Edward Nasserden (PC-Rochester) asked Prime Minister Pearson what action is being taken to keep Studebaker workers in Canada. Mr. Pearson said everything possible is being done.

Mr. Nasserden jumped up again and asked the prime minister to name something that was being done. There was no reply as the Commons Speaker recognized another questioner.
