**Contract Bridge**

ADVANCED ANALYSIS

The following deal led to an argument (which in turn led to a wager) as to whether the contract could or could not have been fulfilled.

South dealer.  
North-South vulnerable.

The bidding:  
South West North East  
Pass Pass 1♣ Pass  
1♥ Pass 2♣ Pass  
2NT Pass 3NT Pass  
3NT Pass

The play up to and including Trick 4 was "accepted by the disputants. This play was: Dummy ducked and East won with the queen. East returned the spade five; South played low, and West won with the jack. West then led the diamond king, and after being permitted to hold the trick, shifted back to spades, laying down the king. South took this trick—and finally went down one.

The player who insisted that the hand could be made, from the point in question, collected the wager. He simply allowed West to win the trick with his spade king! The position now was:

West's next lead would not matter. Assume the diamond jack. Dummy wins, South unblocking his ten. South now leads a club to his blank king and cashes the spade ace, on which dummy discards a club. West must give up a heart, to guard clubs. Now South leads the diamond to dummy and cashes the two high clubs. This squeezes East, who must either surrender his heart stopper, or, by giving up the high spade, permit South to cash the spade seven.
