#### LORD BEAVERBROOK ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Right Honourable Lord Beaverbrook has most generously provided five entrance scholarships to be awarded each year for courses at Mount Allison University. They are of the annual value of \$500.00 and are open to boys and girls who are bonafide residents of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.

Candidates must pass the provincial examinations of Junior Matriculation level or the corresponding Common Examining Board examinations, and attain an average of at least 75% on subjects required for entrance. These must include one foreign language. If a second foreign language is offered, additional consideration will be given the application. An applicant holding a Senior Matriculation or Grade XII certificate should submit it with his application.

In addition to the scholastic requirements the selection committee will take into consideration moral character, industrious habits and financial needs of the candidates.

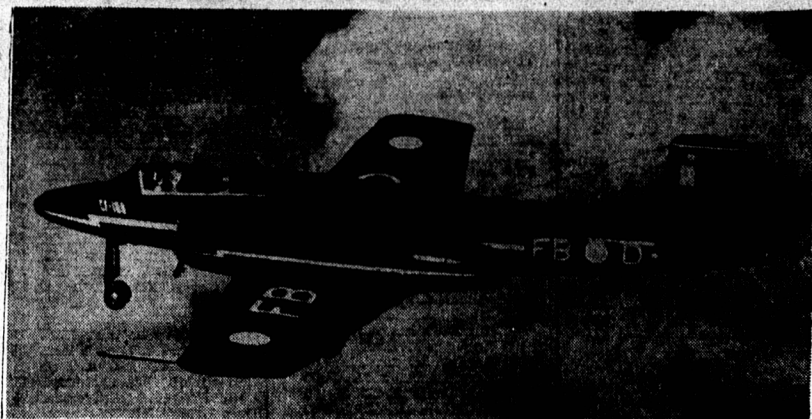
These scholarships will be awarded only to students who will enter upon a regular course leading to one of the following degrees and for the time indicated: Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Fine Arts, four years; Bachelor of Education, five years.

The scholarship will continue from year to year to the completion of the course provided the progress of the student is satisfactory.

### Canadian Jet Sets Toronto-Montreal Record



The CF-100 "Canuck" zoomed at an average speed of 638 miles an hour from Toronto to Montreal to establish what is believed to be a speed record, completing the 325-mile jaunt in 30 minutes and 10 seconds. An experimental jet fighter, the "Canuck" was flown to Dorval airport to take part in trials before Hon. Brooke Claxton, Minister of Defence, and senior R. C. A. F. officials. The CF-100 is a long-range reconnaissance and night jet fighter.
