Que. Steel Industry Plans Await Report From Experts

SHERBROOKE (CP) — Rene Levesque, Quebec's minister, says government policy on establishment of a steel industry cannot be decided until after the cabinet studies a report scheduled to be completed in a few weeks by a group of experts.

In a statement, Mr. Levesque said he wished to clarify published reports of a speech he made Friday to students at the University of Sherbrooke.

In the speech he was quoted as saying the Quebec cabinet had agreed unanimously on five goals to be given priority during the next few years. Mr. Levesque said he was expressing a personal opinion on what projects should be given priority treatment between now and 1967.

He had mentioned a basic steel industry as a springboard for expansion of manufacturing. Mr. Levesque said in his clarifying statement that he looks on a steel industry as one of the springboards essential to the province.

"With all members of the government, I am sure, I hope that steel will soon be one of the basic products of Quebec. Levesque's Quebec's resources with all my mind to see that this project becomes a reality. But I stressed also that we expect to have within a few weeks a report on the feasibility of this major project, and that it was evident that government policy could not be decided until after study of the report."

STRESSED CONTROL. Mr. Levesque said he was quoted as saying Friday that one of the government's goals is the professional training of competent technicians needed for Quebec's economic progress.

He stressed in his speech that control of major sectors of the economy, such as energy, would provide opportunities for the development of key men administrators, engineers and technicians.

The remaining three goals he had mentioned were already part of government policy. They were: Civil service reform to wipe out medieval methods and political intrigues; Re-organization and improvement of the province's educational system.

"The rational channelling of capital" through creation of a universal pension fund that will be of both social and economic benefit to the province.

Opening lead — nine of diamonds

This hand occurred in the final masters national play championship held in Minneapolis last year. It features a point in defense overlooked by many of the contestants.

Most of the North-South pairs arrived at four hearts, which was certainly a reasonable contract. The play usually followed the same course. West leading a singleton diamond and South took with the king.

Declarer played a low heart to the queen, which held, and continued with a low club, taken by the king. East returned the queen of diamonds, which West ruffed. West shifted to a spade

and declarer took the ace, cashed the queen of clubs, and played the king of hearts.

West got the ace of hearts, but it was the last trick for the defense, since South eventually got rid of his other diamond loser on the ace of clubs and thus made four hearts.

However, West could have defeated the contract by discarding on the queen of diamonds instead of ruffing it. The temptation to ruff with the "useless" nine of hearts proved to be the breaking point of the hand.

Suppose West had discarded a club on the queen of diamonds instead of ruffing it. In that case South would have been left out of resource. He would take the diamond with the ace, but would then be left with two diamond losers which he could not possibly escape.

West should have recognized the actual situation for what it was. The nine of diamonds had forced the king on the opening lead and the later play of it in an ace had marked East with a holding of the Q-J-10.

In effect, therefore, West was ruffing his partner's trick, since he ruffed one of declarer's two natural diamond losers. There were no values in dummy on which South could discard. He earned any diamond losers he had, and West therefore should have permitted the queen to force out the king.

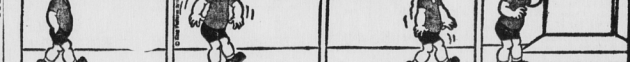
