Hollywood Meeting Far Afield For Awards

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The latest batch of comedies indicates that the contest Hollywood is travelling for subject matter. The movies concern the Pacific war and incarceration. The results are mixed.
Father Goose is the best of the lot. Thanks to the comical male attraction of Cary Grant. This time he is playing an unshaver, returning South Seas escapade, but beneath that stubble is the same suave Grant.
The picture is a natural for Grant. A confirmed misanthrope, he is tricked into becoming a cross-watcher after the Japanese drive through the South Pacific. Who should fall into his charge but prim schoolteacher, Leslie Caron, with a couple of young girls.
As with all recent Grant films, this one has been put together with expert hands, anybody just the right amount of adventure, laughs, scenery, sentiment and a suspicion of sex. About all it lacks is that precious element of surprise that denotes a masterpiece.
Ralph Nelson, who evoked such warm humanity in Ladies and Gentlemen, has his winning ways with Father Goose. Leslie Caron makes a welcome return to American film and Trevor Howard is a proper foil.

Many Defects Uncovered In Bobcat Troop Carrier

OTTAWA (CP)—The Bobcat armored troop carrier had a good body but major defects in the tracks, wheels, shock absorbers, sprockets and lubrication and suspension systems, the defence defence committee has been told.
These were just the major defects. There were many other minor ones.
The Canadian Bobcat program was cancelled in December, 1965, after 10 years of development and expenditures of \$75 million.
The defence and defence production departments Thursday handed over to the committee the details of what officials have described as "this whole sorry mess."
The first costly contract—the actual cost plus an allowance for profit—in the Bobcat program was placed in 1954 with Leyland Motors of Montreal, later absorbed by Canadian Car Company, Montreal. It took more than two years to deliver one vehicle to the army. The cost was \$1,091,836.
