Speaking about the prospects of a Fall election, Mr. Bell said many country electors believe it will take place. They report that a lot of road work is being done and that many people are being given jobs. He added that personally he was doubtful on this point.

"The present Premier is looking for an issue," Mr. Bell said. "It is not three years yet since the last election and he has no excuse to go to the country. He is, I understand, not in a very good position. I am informed that he is looking for other districts than his own to run in. He may try to raise an issue in the next week or two. Some plan may be concocted from this Dominion-Provincial meeting whereby an issue can be raised. The Liberals will try to win the next election at any cost."

Prepare For Arrival Of Potato Pickers

The Unemployment Insurance Commission office at Summerside is busy getting ready to handle the annual migration of workers from Nova Scotia and New Brunswick to the potato fields of Prince County.

Last year approximately 1,900 men were placed with the growers of the County and about 800 of these came from the other Maritime Provinces. The balance were local men.

This year the office has received orders for about 400 men which are more than were requested this time last year. A small trickle of the stream to come, has already started. On Wednesday eleven men arrived from Moncton for Albany and Emerald. On Saturday ten more are expected but the rush will not commence till about the first of October.

The majority of the men, as on other years, will come from Cape Breton but others will be recruited in Amherst, Saint John, Sussex and Moncton. The Federal Government pays transportation expenses of all these men to the Island and this year it will go even further. If the farmers that employ the men certify that they have been satisfactory their return fare will also be paid.

If they are not satisfactory or do not accept jobs arranged for them they will have to find their own way back home. The bulk of the men brought in are for the large potato growing districts around Kinkora, Emerald, Freetown and Bedeque, although many of the men are placed west of Summerside. — S
