

# S'ide Sessions Of Music Festival Cont'd Yesterday

The R.C.A.F. station Choral group drew high praise from adjudicator Kilburne for their excellent rendition of Handel's "Minuet from the Overture to Orlando Sampson" and the 87 points awarded them was the highest mark of the evening session of the Music Festival in Summerside yesterday. Mr. Kilburne said there was a sturdy idealistic quality about their interpretation, and he was particularly pleased with the good contrast between the full choir effects and those of the smaller grouped voices.

The Tighish Boys' Choir gained the second highest mark of the evening, getting 86 for their singing, "Vidi Aquam." Little Billy Perry of Tighish, nine-year-old violinist, drew enthusiastic and sustained applause from the audience, and adjudicator Wharram complimented the little fellow on his good pitch, carefully chosen and consistent time, if a little slow for fingerings, Barcarolle and good handling of the bow for one so young. The evening crowd was a little large for the capacity of St. Mary's Hall, and overflowed into the corridor. Hester McPhee's 88 was high for the day programs. This class, piano solo for girls 15 years and under, highlighted the afternoon program. Mr. Wharram said, "The group was much above average. There was precise playing, splendid accuracy, and pleasing musical shapes and color varieties. The tempo was well set and maintained. It was a very musical program," was how Mr. Wharram summed it up. Ruth Cairns of Summerside was high point winner, getting three firsts and one second for her piano and vocal solos.

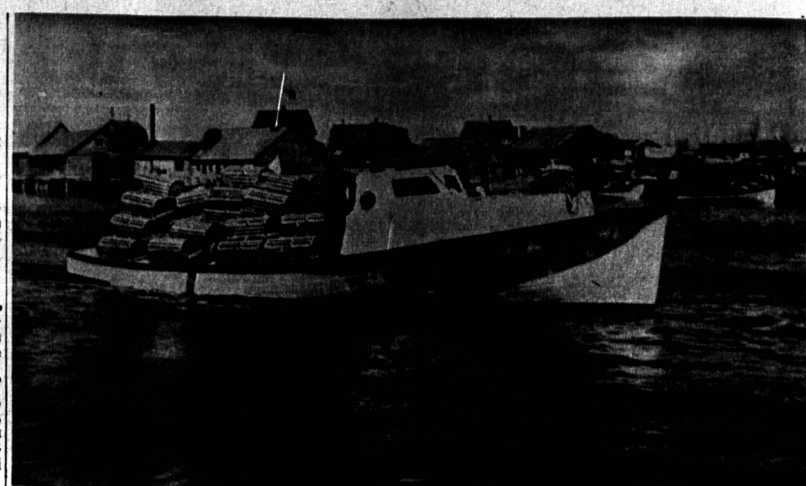

The average fishing boat carries about eighty traps with a new larger type launched this year by Myrl Matthews having a capacity of 250. With clear skies and a light breeze the task of running lines was made more pleasant than is sometimes the case and by nightfall over one half the traps had been placed in position. Practically all traps in the Alberton, Tighish area were set out by last evening and first reports from a small number of traps inspected indicate a good season in prospect.

# Fourth Prince Candidates Nominated By Liberals

—Two farmer candidates, C. C. Baker of Kensington, provincial minister of agriculture, and J. George MacKay of Albany, minister without portfolio in the present Provincial Government, were yesterday nominated as councillor and assemblyman candidates, respectively representing the Liberal Party in the 4th District of Prince in the provincial election to be held May 25th. There were no other names before the convention.

Mr. Baker's nomination was moved by Peter D. Melvor of Newton, seconded by Ray Cameron of Albany, and supported by T. J. Inman of Bedouin. Mr. MacKay was nominated by Alexander B. MacFarlane of Fernwood, and seconded by Parnell McCarville of Kinkora.

Mr. Baker has been elected five times to the Provincial Legislature, and has served as minister of agriculture for the past six years. Mr. MacKay was first elected by acclamation in a by-election called to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Horace Wright, who was re-elected in the last provincial election, and was taken into the cabinet as a minister without portfolio following the resignation of Attorney General Walter A. Darby who was appointed a judge of the County Court of Prince County.

The nominating convention held in Bedouin yesterday afternoon was presided over by Mr. Edson G. Rayner, president of the East Prince Liberal Association, with Mr. Morley M. Bell of Summerside, acting as secretary.

# Liberal Candidates In Fourth Prince Nominated

—The Hon. Forrest W. Phillips, Speaker of the House and farmer of Mount Royal and Mr. Charles MacKay, farmer of Northam were nominated by the Liberal Party to contest the Second District of Prince in the forthcoming provincial election at a nomination convention yesterday afternoon at Ellerslie. Mr. Phillips' nomination as councillor was by acclamation and was moved by Mr. John Yeo, Knutsford, seconded by Mr. George Adams, Portage. Mr. MacKay's nomination for assemblyman was moved by Turner Moore, Enmore and seconded by Herbert Enman, Enmore.

The names of Harris Rogers, Coleman Arnold Wood, Cape and Donald MacLean, Tyne Valley, also were brought before the convention as candidates for assemblyman, but the latter declined the nomination. Two ballots were necessary in the three-way contest with Mr. MacKay emerging the winning candidate for assemblyman.

Premier A. W. Matheson addressed the meeting, as did the Hon. Mr. Phillips, Mr. MacLean, Mr. MacKay, Mr. Wood and Mr. Rogers. The meeting was presided over by Mr. Percy Adams, president of the West Prince Liberal Association.—S
