Defending Champion Leads Way Into Semi-finals Of Amateur Golf Tournament

ST. BRUNO, Que., July 27—The defending champion, likeable Ted Adams of Chillihothe, Mo., and three Canadians marched through two rounds today to qualify for the semi-finals of the Canadian amateur golf championship.

Left to challenge Adams were Ken Black of Vancouver, runner-up in 1933; Phil Farley of Toronto, runner-up in 1937; and Henry Martell, the Alberta champion from Edmonton who has never got past the round of 16 before this. Martell gets the job of stopping Adams in one 16-hole semi-final tomorrow.

The champion, his game improving through every round, stopped Bill Taylor of Montreal in the afternoon quarter-finals, 2 and 1, after Black defeated Jack Nash of London, Ont., 5 and 4; Martell looked 18-year-old Ted B. Adams of Boston, 3 and 2, and Farley trounced Jack Archer of Montreal, 7 and 5.

Lifting his game just enough to beat each opponent, Adams was given harder work than any of the other semi-finalists. But he seemed to be playing within himself at all times and he was never behind in beating Taylor or Marcel Pinsonnault of Montreal in the earlier round. Adams went to the home green before disposing of Pinsonnault, one up.

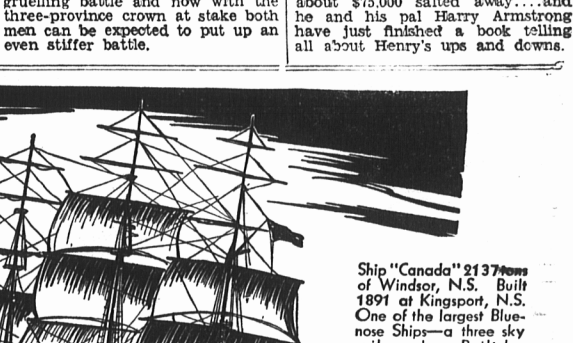
