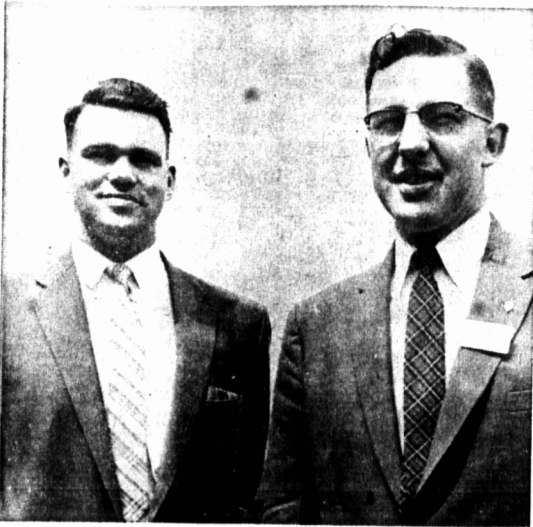

ISTANBUL (AP)—A destructive earthquake shook a wide area southeast of Istanbul Sunday, killing seven persons and injuring 25.

tofts 100 miles from Istanbul. All casualties were suffered in that area. The deputy governor of the province said 80 per cent of the houses and buildings in the stricken area, comprising 12,000 population, were damaged. In Istanbul three jolts were felt.  
Dishes jumped, windows banged and buildings seemed to sway but no damage was reported.
