

Cuba Orders 10 Factory Ships

ST. JOHN'S (CP) President R.W. Duncan of Castrol Oil Canada Ltd. says a Spanish shipyard is under contract to build 10 fish factory ships for Cuba during the next two years. Mr. Duncan said in a telephone interview from Toronto

that Cuba has placed an order for delivery of one of the ships every two months. Mr. Duncan was commenting further on an announcement here Tuesday that his firm is to establish a marine servicing depot in this port.

Determined to lead his people in the ways of the Lord, Jehoshaphat discouraged worship in the local shrines and tried to wipe out Baal worship. —II Chronicles 17.

Appointing new judges through the land to guide, judge and correct the people, Jehoshaphat established justice for all in their daily affairs. —II Chronicles 19:1-7.

He allied himself with Israel's evil King Ahab in the ill-fated war with Syria, earning the disgust and rebuke of certain prophets of Judah. —II Chronicles 18.

To preserve the Hebrews' spiritual legacy, he set up a religious education program for the people. —II Chronicles 19:8-11.

Jehoshaphat, king of Judah, was in most ways a good king. The son and successor of King Asa, a "good" king who left the kingdom stronger than he found it, he began his reign determined to continue the commendable work of his father. He attempted to eradicate Baal worship; he was a military leader of note; he was able to hold the nation together; he was feared or respected enough by Philistine, Arabian and other neighbors that they paid him tribute.

But he did not devote himself exclusively to the nation's material welfare, to increasing her military strength or developing her commerce. Jehoshaphat well knew that a nation's permanent security and true welfare rests upon solid, genuine religious

convictions, and he led his people toward this spiritual objective. On the whole, Jehoshaphat's influence was for good, for he was a strong and purposeful ruler. Nevertheless, he was a mixture of good and bad, which sometimes led him to compromise with evil situations and people, such as the military alliance with Israel's evil King Ahab in the ill-fated war with Syria.

Ahab and Jehoshaphat were contemporaries and, though they were poles apart in religion and morals, there was peace and friendship between them, much to the disgust of certain of the prophets of Judah, who rebuked Jehoshaphat for keeping bad company. Jehoshaphat seems to have been a king who assessed the evils of his day, adopted certain policies for dealing with them, and pushed through his reforms with vigor. The exact changes he made in Judah's judicial system are totally unknown. Doubtless he found widespread corruption, upon solid, genuine religious

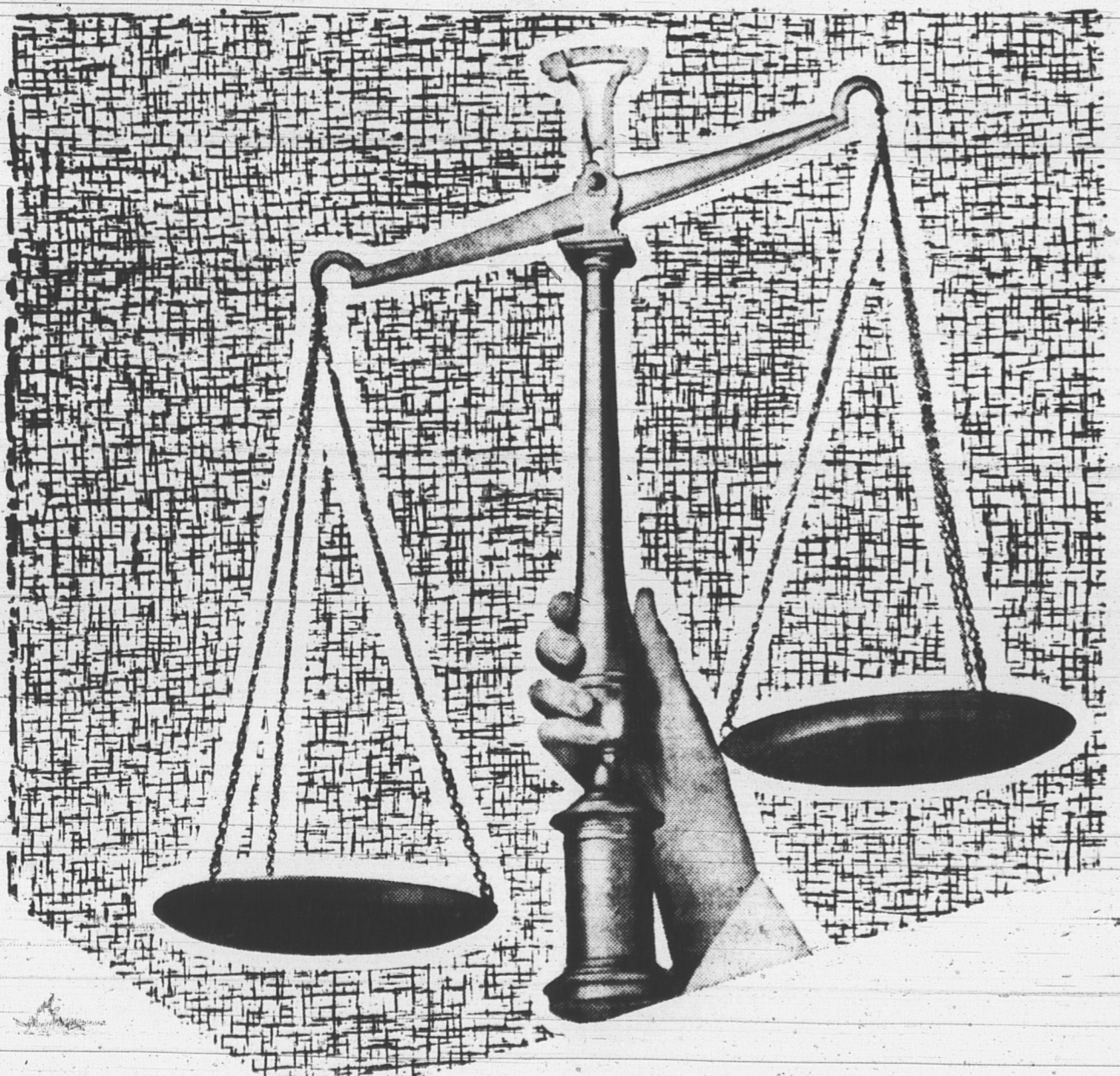

Celebrate 10 Million Publication

A special ceremony marking the publishing of the 10,000,000th copy of the English Ruby Bible was held in Toronto recently. During the annual General Board meetings of the Canadian Bible Society, the President, Dr. Henry D. Hicks, was presented with this specially bound book by the Rev. John T. Watson, the general secretary of the British and Foreign Bible Society in London.

No other edition of the English Bible has been circulated in such large quantity as this King James version of the small hand-sized Bible, which at one time was known as the "shilling Bible." Still one of the lowest priced bibles to be found anywhere, this edition was reset in its present format in 1931 by funds made available from the Canadian Bible Society. Publishing the 10 million copies has required 60 tons of printing ink alone.

Originally produced for the Canadian market, this Bible known in the trade as No. 5,000 has been printed in England, with 17 of every 20 copies being shipped overseas to hundreds of countries. Officers appointed at the General Board meeting for the Canadian Bible Society for the ensuing year were, Dr. Henry D. Hicks, Halifax, President, with three vice-presidents: Very Rev. Ritchie Bell, D.D., of Montreal; Rev. T. R. Davies, D.D., of Toronto; and Ven. B. P. Watney, D.D., of Vancouver. Chancellor R. H. Soward, Q.C., of Toronto, is Honorary Treasurer, and Mr. I. C. Robinson of Calgary is the Hon. Recording Secretary.
