WINNIPEG (CP) — Winnipeg radio stations Thursday joined Calgary and Vancouver in criticism of Elvis Presley's album of Christmas songs.

No Indication When CNS To Resume West Indies Service

HALIFAX (CP)—R. J. Sauve, general manager of Canadian National Steamships, said Thursday resumption of CNS West Indies service "depends on a lot of things" but gave no indication when it might be restored.

He told reporters there would be no immediate developments relating to resumption of service by eight CNS freighters, now tied up in Halifax harbor, adding "it is impossible to be specific at this time."

Mr. Sauve did not say why he had come to Halifax. He said he usually visits here four times a year.

In other developments Thursday, John Wood of Montreal, who said he is in Halifax as an agent of the National Association of Marine Engineers (N.A.M.E.), said CNS engineers have "reiterated their stand" not to sail with "scab crews," regardless of any change in registry.

Registry was recently transferred from Montreal to Trinidad.

Mr. Wood said he sent a telegram to CNS President Donald Gordon asking him to produce an earlier telegram, sent to him by 70 CNS officers Wednesday, with signatures, particularly of engineers officers. The officers' telegram asked for immediate restoration of service.

In Ottawa, CLC President Claude Jodoin will seek Prime Minister Diefenbaker's personal intervention in the dispute at a meeting next Monday.

The ships have been tied up since last June. The Seafarers International Union (S.I.U.), representing some 220 CNS seamen, seeks a 20-per-cent wage increase above the present basic scale of \$204 a month plus board.

The union turned down a conciliation board recommendation of a 10-per-cent increase plus fringe benefits and a later company offer of a 15-per-cent raise. Officers accepted a comparable increase.
