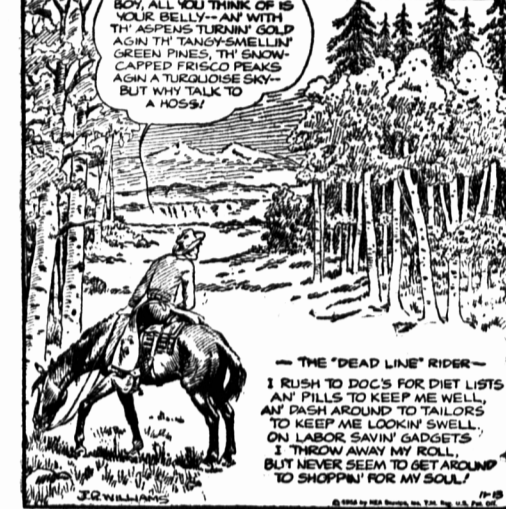

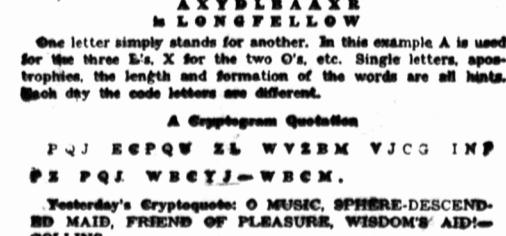
Which Was Right?

Balloonists Find Sky Blue-Black At Record 76,000 Ft.

U.S. Navy balloonists soared to a record altitude of more than 14 miles Thursday then plummeted in Nebraska's sparsely settled sandhills when trouble developed. The balloon, taking off at the "Stratobowl" in the Black Hills near Rapid City, S.D., carried Cmdrs. Malcolm D. Ross, 37, and Morton L. Lewis, 43, to 76,000 feet.
They reached that height at 10:09 a.m. CST, two hours and 50 minutes after castoff. Outside their seven-foot pressurized aluminum globe, they saw a "dark blue black" sky. The earth looked black, too.
They began to descend at 1,000 feet a minute. At 56,000 feet Lewis radioed they were slipping coffee and "we invite you in."
Then something went wrong: the airman said later "we had no idea what."
The rate of descent increased to 1,400 feet a minute.
Ross and Lewis began pitching out their oxygen and radio gear trying vainly to reduce their rate of fall. Their last radio message was: "We will be out of communication for some time. We are beginning to..." the message broke off at this point.
The drop, though fast and dangerous, was smooth, they recalled afterwards. As they neared the earth they cut away the big plastic gas-filled balloon.
A big cargo parachute attached to the gondola carried them safely into a pasture seven miles northwest of Brownlee, in northern Nebraska, about 11:30 a.m.
