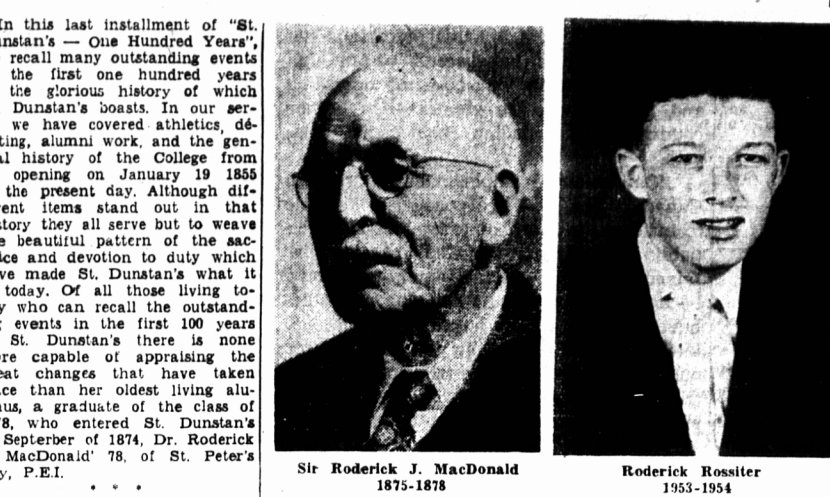

Sir Roderick J. MacDonald 1875-1978

In this last installment of "St. Dunstan's—One Hundred Years", we recall many outstanding events in the first one hundred years of the glorious history of which St. Dunstan's boasts. In our series we have covered athletics, debating, alumni work, and the general history of the College from its opening on January 19 1855 to the present day. Although different items stand out in that history they all serve but to weave one beautiful pattern of the sacrifice and devotion to duty which have made St. Dunstan's what it is today. Of all those living to-day who can recall the outstanding events in the first 100 years of St. Dunstan's there is none more capable of appraising the great changes that have taken place than her oldest living alumnus, a graduate of the class of 1878, who entered St. Dunstan's in September of 1874, Dr. Roderick J. MacDonald '78, of St. Peter's Bay, P.E.I.

The eighty year span from grandfather to grandson, from Roderick MacDonald who registered in 1875 to Roderick Rosstier of Charlottetown in 1954, has witnessed the gradual but steady growth of St. Dunstan's from one building institution in 1875 to the beautiful university campus of today from a faculty of four to a faculty of twenty four, from a curriculum devoted solely to the arts to one which prepares both men and women for degrees in Arts, Science, and Commerce and offers them as well recognized pre-medical and pre-dental training.

visit with his brother in Philadelphia he returned to Prince Edward Island and made arrangements to practice medicine in Cardigan. In his later years many and signal honors have been conferred on Dr. MacDonald. The Medical Associations have, on several occasions, paid him well-deserved tribute for he has certainly been one of the brightest stars in that great profession which he himself boasts to be "the greatest benefactor ever given to man." But of all the honors that have come to him none is more prized than that which was conferred on him by His Holiness Pope Plus XII when, in 1952, he was made a Papal Knight of St. Gregory the Great with the title of Sir Roderick MacDonald. Well known artists such as Yousef Karsh and John Fisher have sought him out for photographs or interviews. And yet in his multitude of friends and admirers he is and will continue to be just Doctor Roddy, a great doctor whose complete dedication to his noble profession will never be surpassed.

St. Dunstan's is proud to claim Doctor MacDonald as her oldest living alumnus. At the Centennial Reunion of her Alumni in August his will be the place of honor. May his present excellent health and continued happiness grace the remaining years of his noble life.
