

### Is Injured In Explosion

HALIFAX (CP)—Dennis Markley, 79, of Halifax, was in critical condition after being hurled by an explosion through the window of the north end Liberal headquarters office Wednesday.

Markley has second and third degree burns, hospital officials said.

The explosion occurred when an oil stove ignited on the main floor of the three-story frame structure, firemen said.

One fireman suffered lacerations to hands and wrists. The blaze caused extensive damage to the first-floor interior.

Four other people in the building at the time were shaken by the explosion but escaped uninjured.

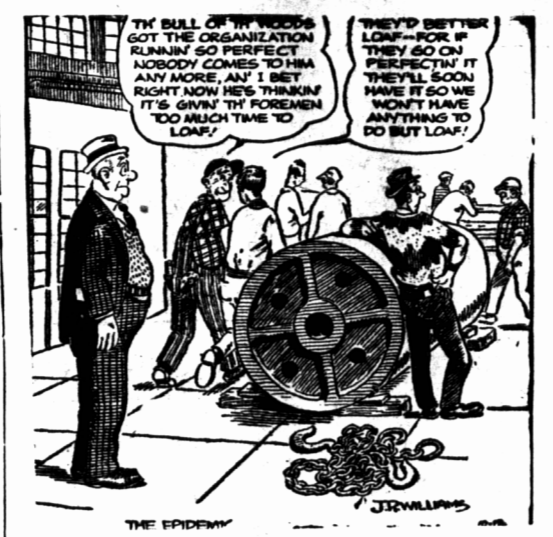

(Top Record-Holder in Masters' Individual Championship Play)

West dealer.  
Both sides vulnerable.

**NORTH**  
♠ A K 6  
♥ K 8  
♦ J 9  
♣ Q J 10 8 6 2

**EAST**  
♠ 8 3  
♥ 6 4  
♦ 10 8 5 3 2  
♣ A 9 5

**SOUTH**  
♠ J 9 7 2

The bidding:  
West North East South  
Pass 1 ♣ Pass 1 ♣  
Pass 2 ♣ Pass 3 ♣

Opening lead—king of diamonds.

South's three heart jump bid, based on an opening bid of his own opposite North's opening bid, was fully justified. His hand has sufficient flexibility, moreover, to play for a game in hearts, clubs or notrump, depending upon which of these his partner chose.

Declarer trumped the second diamond lead, drew four trumps, East discarding a spade and a club, and then drove out the ace of clubs. East suddenly found himself in complete command of the situation, there being no trumps around to hinder him, and dashed off with four diamond tricks to the resounding tune of down three.

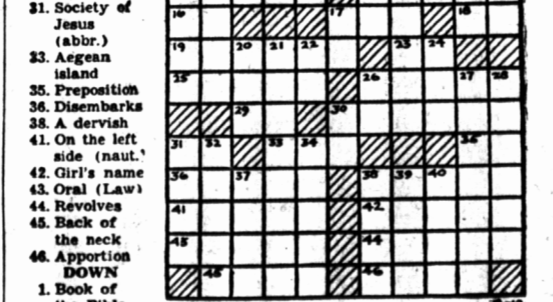

### Gets Back \$1,838 Lost On July 17

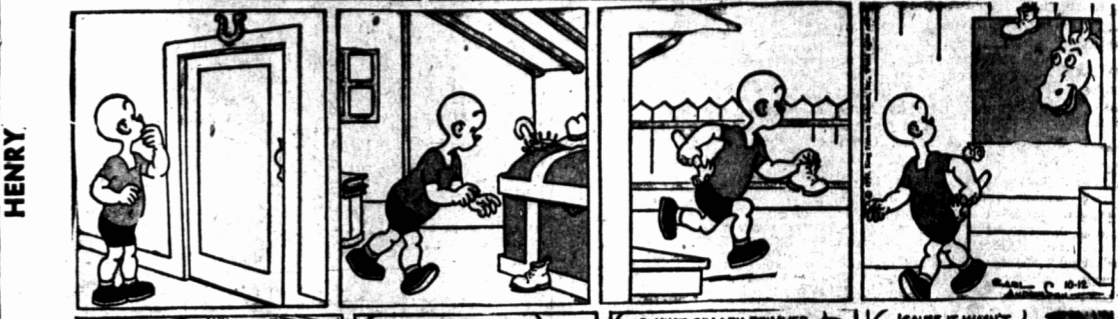
