

# Conservatives Nominate Candidates In 5th Prince

SUMMERSIDE — Dr. Hubert McNeill and Lorne Monkley were chosen as Conservative Assemblyman and Councillor candidates for the Fifth District of Prince. The nominating convention in Summerside last night had one hundred percent of the eligible delegates in attendance.

The convention also established a new Conservative Party history in P.E.I. when a woman, Mrs. Don Lidstone, had her name placed before the convention as a Councillor candidate, support for her by delegates eliminated a third nominee, Robert Dewar, on the first ballot, but lost out to Mr. Monkley when the second vote was taken.

Dr. McNeill received the necessary majority over one other Assemblyman candidate, Dr. Alex MacDonald.

Mr. Monkley, 45, is secretary-treasurer of Amalgamation Dairies Ltd., and resides in Summerside with his wife and three children. He is a veteran of the Second World War, and is a major in the Reserve Army.

He is a past president of the Summerside Branch of the Canadian Legion, a member of the Summerside Lions Club, and is active in civic and political affairs.

Dr. McNeill, 37, is a practicing medical doctor, and resides in Summerside with his wife and five children. His grandfather and his father, D.F. McNeill, both were members of past provincial legislatures. His nomination will be carrying on a family leadership service that has extended for more than half a century.

Dr. McNeill, along with five brothers and one sister, served actively with the Canadian Armed Forces during the Second World War. He received his medical degree from Dalhousie Uni-

versity after the war, and returned to Summerside in 1953 where he commenced practice. He is the present president of the East Prince Conservative Association, and is also a past president of the Summerside Branch of the Canadian Legion.

The nomination of Mr. Monkley was moved by George McMahon and seconded by Gerald B. Sheen; the nomination of Mrs. Don Lidstone was moved by Urban Laughlin and seconded by Mrs. Fred Matthews; the nominations of Robert Dewar was moved by Major MacDonald and seconded by Fred L.D. Arsenault.

On the assemblyman ballots the nomination of Dr. Hubert McNeill was moved by Frank Arnett, and seconded by Alban Gallant; while the nomination of Dr. Alex MacDonald was moved by Dave Miller and second-

ed by Martin DesRoches. Members of the nominating committee in charge of balloting were Bill Arnett, Mrs. Robert Dewar, Jack Harper and Gordon Rogers.

The convention was presided over by the president of the Fifth District, George Key, Jr.

The public hall of the A.A. Building on Water Street was the location of the convention, and the delegates were briefly addressed by the leader of the Conservative party in the province, Walter R. Shaw; by Dr. Orville H. Phillips, M.P., and by Frank Myers, M.L.A.

The nomination of the two candidates last night completed the selection of 30 Conservative candidates who have now been the 30-member legislature in the named to contest every seat in provincial election to be held on September 1st.
