No. 1 Company, Captain D. Flynn—Bounded West by division line between Lots 56 and 43; South by Gulf of St. Lawrence; East by Gulf of St. Lawrence and Burke's Road; North by the north boundary line of Michael Ark Christian's farm.

No. 2 Company, Captain L. Peters—Bounded South by Gulf of St. Lawrence; West by Burke's Road, East by Mill Road to the southern boundary line of Mrs. Mahar's farm, and near boundary line of farms fronting on west line of Lot 44, North by the northern boundary line of Patrick McClusky's, junior, farm, and the northern boundary line of J. Dawon's farm.

No. 3 Company, Captain A. Leslie—Bounded South by Gulf of St. Lawrence; West by Mill Road to the southern boundary line of Mrs. Mahar's farm, and rear boundary line of farms fronting on west line of Lot 44; East by Souris River to McGowan's Bridge, and by division line between Lots 44 and 45; North by northern boundary line of Fidele Chiverie's farm, and from eastern end of said line in a direct line east to division line between Lots 44 and 45.

No. 4 Company, Captain M. McCormack—Bounded South by Gulf of St. Lawrence, from Stone's wharf to Souris Harbour; West by Souris River to McGowan's Bridge, and by division line between Lots 44 and 45; East by Lot 45 Line Road and Public Road to Stone's wharf; North by north boundary line of Joseph McVarish's farm.

No. 5 Company, Captain N. Leslie—Bounded South by Public Road to Stone's wharf and Gulf of St. Lawrence; West by Lot 45 Line Road; East by New Harmony Road; North by the north boundary line of Patrick Cantwell's farm.

No. 6 Company, Captain J. Stewart—Bounded South by Gulf of St. Lawrence; West by New Harmony Road; East by Baltic Road; North by the northern boundary line of G. Chiverie's farm, and the projected Tarentum Road.

No. 7 Company, Captain E. McEachern—Bounded South by the Gulf of St. Lawrence; West by the Baltic Road, Lot 46; East by South Lake, Cross Roads, Lot 47; North by the northern boundary line of John Mellick's farm, and from west end of said line in a direct line to the projected Tarentum Road.

No. 8 Company, Captain D. Beaton—Bounded South by the Gulf of St. Lawrence; West by the South Lake Cross Roads to the southern boundary line of L. Murphy's farm, and from the eastern end of said line in a direct line to the North Lake Creek Bridge; East by the Gulf of St. Lawrence; North by the Gulf of St. Lawrence.

No. 9 Company, Captain D. Campbell—Bounded North by the Gulf of St. Lawrence; West by the eastern boundary line of St. Columbia Glebe, from thence in a due South line to the projected Tarentum Road; East by the South Lake Cross Roads to southern boundary line of L. Murphy's farm, and from eastern end of said line in a direct line to the North Lake Creek Bridge; South by the projected Tarentum Road to the eastern end thereof, and from thence in a direct line to the southern boundary line of John Mellick's farm and by said line of farm to the South Lake Cross Roads.

No. 10 Company, Captain D. McDonald—Bounded North by the Gulf of St. Lawrence; East by the eastern boundary line of the St. Columbia Glebe, and from thence due South to the projected Tarentum Road; West by the Baltic Road, Lot 46; South by projected Tarentum Road.

No. 11 Company, Captain C. McEachern—Bounded north by the Gulf of St. Lawrence; east by the Baltic road, Lot 46; west by the western boundary line of Allan McDonald's farm, and from the southern end of said line in a direct line to New Harmony Road; south by the northern boundary line of G. Chiverie's farm and the projected Tarentum Road.

No. 12 Company, Captain H. McDonald—Bounded north by the Gulf of St. Lawrence; east by the western boundary line of Allan McDonald's farm, and from the southern end of said line in a direct line to New Harmony Road; west by division line between Lots 44 and 45; south by the north boundary line of Patrick Cantwell's farm, and the north boundary line of Joseph McVarish's farm.

No. 13 Company, Captain A. Gillis—Bounded north by the Gulf of St. Lawrence; east by division line between Lots 44 and 45; west by division line between Lots 43 and 41; south by the northern boundary line of J. Dawon's farm, and the north boundary line of Fidele Chiverie's farm.

No. 14 Company, Captain P. McPhee—Bounded north by Gulf of St. Lawrence; west by division line between Lots 42 and 43; east by division line between Lots 43 and 41; south by the north boundary line of Michael Ark Christian's farm, and the north boundary line of P. McCluskey's, junior, farm.
