

400 Canadians Win Sweepstakes

Almost 400 Canadians split an Irish Hospitals Sweepstakes jackpot of more than \$1,350,000 Saturday with four winning top prizes of \$150,000 each and nine others winning \$50,000 and \$30,000, respectively, on the top three horses in the Cambridge-shire Handicap at Newmarket, England.

Tickets on Dites, the long-shot winner, were held by Alex Keith of New Westminster, B.C., Aulay Morrison of Glace Bay, N.S., Claire Marion of Montreal and H. E. Hallatt of Hamilton. Their prizes of \$50,000 each amounts to about \$150,000 in Canadian funds.

Like many of the other winners, Keith said he didn't want any publicity, but told reporters before driving off in a late-model car that he had bought so many sweeps tickets that "you couldn't add them up on an adding machine."

Another long-time buyer who finally clicked was Gordon Simons of Burgessville, Ont., near Woodstock, who won \$30,000 with a ticket on third-place Tarqogan. Before that, he said, the only thing he had ever won was "a bottle of liquor in a Legion raffle."

Others winning \$30,000 third prizes were William Sonto of Burford, Ont.; Marie-Anne Gregoire, Montreal; John Galka

and John Sparis, both of Hamilton, and a jointly-held ticket identified only as "Diana and Leah" of Moncton.

The three \$50,000 winners on second-place Isis were Dan D. Ellis of Havelock, Ont., near Peterborough, and two Toronto-area residents, George Mulley of Don Mills and M. Hildebrandt of Bay Ridges.

The Cambridge-shire draw, last of three held yearly on British races in the international lot-

tery which aids hospitals in the Irish Republic, produced a total of 391 Canadian-held tickets on the 93 horses eligible for the Cambridge-shire. Of these, only 35 went to the post.

HOLDERS OF TICKETS ON THE 32 horses who ran out of the money will win prizes of about \$1,100 each, or as high as \$1,300 depending on the total of the pool. The same prizes go to holders of tickets on the non-starters, who had no chance at the big

money. Because sale of sweepstakes tickets is illegal in Canada, no estimate could be obtained of the amount of money contributed by Canadians in the Cambridge-shire draw.

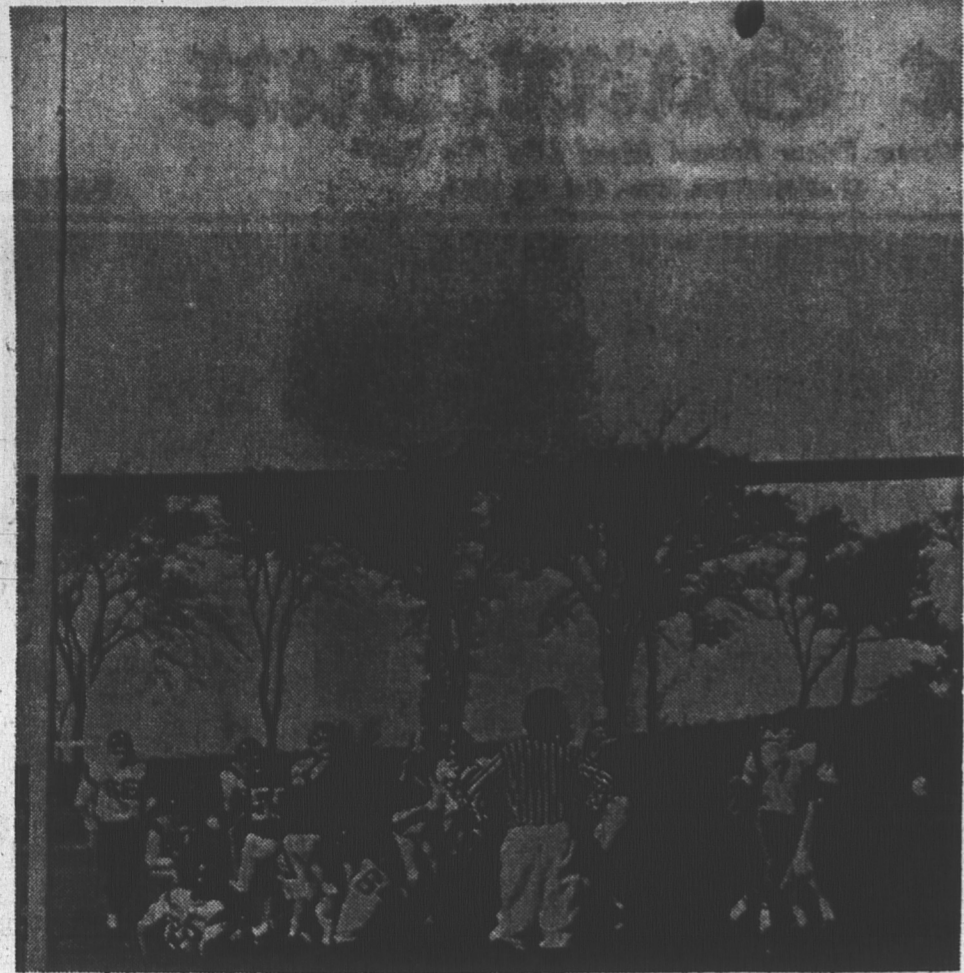
Montreal Tops Hawks At Home

Hawks Enter Season With DeJordy Starting Goalie

In Chicago Stadium, the 16,000-seat bull-ring of the National Hockey League, the man under the gun is a 27-year-old carpenter from St. Hyacinthe, Que.

Dennis DeJordy has pulled on the big red No. 1 sweater of Glenn Hall and, as DeJordy goes, so could go Chicago Black Hawks.

With Hall in the nets last year, Chicago finished second to Montreal Canadiens in the regular season, bowing to Detroit Red Wings in the Stanley Cup semi-finals.

But Hall, a reluctant hero who sometimes left the ice in mid-game to throw up on the sidelines, has retired to a farm.

Coach Billy Reay says he sees "no reason why DeJordy can't get the job done."

"He's been an all-star in every league he has played in."

HALL OFFERED RANS
For DeJordy, 30 years in the Chicago organization including three as back-up man for Hall, it's a formidable challenge.

Hall won the Yezina Trophy in 1963-64; he made the all-star team in 1957-58, 1959-60, 1962-63 and 1963-64; he was named to the second all-star team in 1960-61 and 1961-62.

The chunky left-hander from Humboldt, Sask., played 552 games in a row, an all-time record—30,000 consecutive minutes under fire.

Manager Tommy Ivan says Chicago made Hall "a good offer with a substantial increase, but as far as we're concerned he has retired."

Reay is looking for help at centre ice where he has Stan Mikita, runner-up to Hull in the scoring race last season with 30 goals and 48 assists, Phil Esposito, Fred Stanfield and Wally Boyer.

"We've talked to all the clubs about this problem."

Possible trade bait is Camille Henry, the slender power-play specialist. New York Rangers, who gave him up two seasons back, would like him and several other clubs have shown interest but they're not prepared to meet the asking price—a first-stringer.

STILL HAVE BOBBY
Although goal may be a question-mark for the Hawks, they have to be regarded as contenders for two reasons—Hull, the fabulous left-winger who scored a record 54 goals

last season, and Mikita, the truculent centre.

Hull is likely to start the season with Esposito as his centre and Ken Hodge, a sophomore, at right wing. Hodge scored six goals and assisted on 19 others last season and Hawks are looking for a realization of the potential he showed as a high-scoring junior in St. Catharines, Ont.

Mikita will probably have

Kenny Wharram and Doug Mohs as his linemates, but the No. 3 line is far from set.

On defence, Pierre Pilote has recovered from last season's aches and pains, Pat Stapleton was flying in camp and Matt Ravlich looked good. But the depth of the defensive corps will depend on how well John Miszuk does and whether Ed Van Impe can make the team.

Dites Wins Handicap For Huge 33-1 Irish Payoff

NEWMARKET, England (AP)—Dites won the Cambridge-shire Handicap Saturday by a short head at long-shot odds of 33 to 1 and won a fortune for people who thought they were on a loser.

Thirty-four horses started the

1 1/4-mile race over a turf course. The race soon involved only 33 when Princelone unseated jockey Joe Mercer in the early stages and the race went on without him.

It was any horse's race until the last furlong when it became a battle between Dites and another long shot, 40-to-1 Isis. Dites got the nod in a photo finish by a head.

Tarqogan was 1 1/2 lengths back in third place.

Tarqogan was joint favorite at odds of 8 to 1 with American-owned Americas. Vital Issue came fourth, again at odds of 33 to 1.

Dites, a four-year-old chestnut gelding by Douteille out of Parlex Vous, was ridden by apprentice jockey David Maitland. The horse is trained in England by Harvey Leader for owner Bob Midwood.

Dites got his head in front a furlong from home. Isis put in a strong bid but Dites held off the challenge.

Tarqogan found the top weight of 132 pounds just too much to repeat his victory of last year.

In the race run just before the Cambridge-shire, American-born Comtesse De La Valdene's Irish colt, Pieces of Eight, won the Champion Stakes and first prize of 26,927 pounds or \$68,916.

Pieces of Eight, the 5-to-4 betting favorite, won by a short head over Ballycriptic, 10 to 1, with Tesco Bay, at 100 to 7, finishing third a half-length behind.

The Cambridge-shire overshadows in popularity the Champion Stakes, one of the richest races of the British season.

The victory was worth 6,220 pounds or \$18,660 to Midwood. Isis won \$696 or \$2,088 and Tarqogan won \$328 pounds or \$984.

For the lucky people holding Irish Sweepstake tickets on Dites, the victory was worth 50,000 or \$150,000. The tickets are sold all over the world.

Nicklaus Wins Sahara Tourney

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP)—Masters champion Jack Nicklaus shot a five-under-par 68 Saturday to win the \$100,000 Sahara invitational golf tournament by three strokes with a 72-hole total of 282.

The victory was worth \$20,000. Nicklaus broke the tournament wide open on the first nine holes, firing a five-under-par 31 over the par 35-35-71 paradise Valley Country Club.

In the run down the stretch, Miller Barber, who led going into the final round, pulled even with Nicklaus at the 12th hole but fell back after 14, and the 26-year-old Nicklaus, who also holds the British open championship, pulled out in front.

The tournament developed into a struggle for second place between Barber and Arnold Palmer, with \$12,000 in second-place money and \$7,500 for third.

It would up in a tie at 283 when Palmer posted a 67 and Barber a 70.

National open champion Bill Casper, whose 65 in the third round put him in close contention quickly fell back and wound up with a 74 for 290 and a tie with Bob McCallister, who also had a 74.

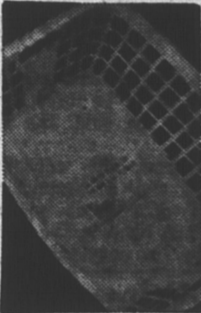
Gardner Dickinson, with a 68, and George Archer, 69, tied at 287, while Chi Chi Rodriguez's 70 gave him 289.

Nicklaus had three birdies and an eagle on the first nine.

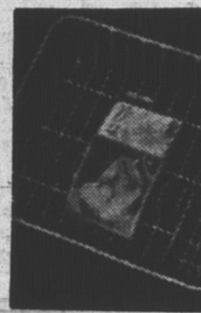
