## Shares Week's News Spotlight

**Prime Minister India**  
Gandhi of India flew to Moscow last week to enlist Soviet support for her efforts to initiate Vietnamese peace negotiations.

But her efforts appeared doomed in the face of angry charges by Soviet Premier Alexei Kosygin that the United States was guilty of "imperialism and barbarism on an international scale" in Viet Nam.

Indian spokesmen at a Soviet-Indian friendship meeting Thursday night appeared to have given a rebuff to Kosygin's peace proposals by saying an end to the war in Viet Nam.

The Soviet premier reiterated the readiness of the Soviet Union and the other Warsaw Pact nations to allow "volunteers" to fight in Viet Nam if Hanoi, the North Vietnamese capital, called for their help.

The Indian prime minister arrived Tuesday in Moscow for a five-day visit to urge the Soviet government to refer in its opposition to the reopening of the 1954 Geneva conference which ended the French-Indochina war and led to the division of Viet Nam.

The Soviet Union and Britain, co-chairmen of the Geneva conference, have continuing responsibilities for the 1954 agreements.

Gandhi was scheduled to leave Moscow today, a day before Prime Minister Wilson arrives in the Soviet capital to seek an accord on initiatives toward ending the Vietnamese conflict.

### FAVOR AGREEMENTS

It was announced in Paris Friday that French President de Gaulle and King Savang Lathana of Laos have agreed that a return to the Geneva agreements is the only possible solution to the Vietnamese war.

A communique published after a four-day official visit to France by the Laotian king said also the two heads of state expressed their profound anxiety over the situation in Viet Nam, whose aggression constitutes a threat to the independence and neutrality of Laos.

### ROMBING CONTINUES

American jets flew a record of 114 missions against North Viet Nam Thursday resulting in four clashes between U.S. raiders and Communist MIGs, as the war in Viet Nam continued.

The Prince Edward Island Liberal party led by Alex B. Campbell, M. Monday swept both seats in a deferred election in the riding of Kings Mt and gained a majority in the provincial legislature, defeating the Progressive Conservative government of Premier Walter R. Shaw.

### LIBERALS IN OPPOSITION

The victory in the two-member constituency gave the Liberals in opposition since 1959 a total of 17 seats in the 32-seat legislature.

The two parties had 18 seats apiece after the May 30 provincial election. Monday's election had been delayed by the death May 26 of Liberal candidate William Acorn.

### NURSES SLAIN

Eight student nurses were slain early Thursday in Chicago in one of the most savage multiple murders in the history of crime.

A nurse escaped death by falling under a bed in the house that served as a dormitory for the South Chicago Community Hospital.

The survivor, Corazon Amuran of the Philippines, told police that the murderer was a white man, about 25, six feet tall, who weighed about 170 pounds. Police continued a massive manhunt.

### RACE RIOTS

Governor Otto Kerner of Illinois ordered the state national guard Friday to restore order in Chicago after three nights of disturbances on Chicago's West Side swelled into a full-scale riot with sniping, looting and exchanges of gunfire between police and snipers.

In the third night of rioting at least two Negroes were shot and killed six policemen were wounded and more than 300 persons were arrested. Numerous civilians were wounded.

The disorders began when police tried to turn off a fire hydrant. Negroes protested against the action, arguing that they need a place to cool off because of a lack of swimming pools.

### AIR ACCORD SIGNED

Canada and the Soviet Union Monday signed an agreement in Ottawa to set up an air service between Montreal and Moscow.

The agreement approving service by Aeroflot, the Soviet national airline, and Air Canada, was signed by Prime Minister Pearson and Soviet Deputy Premier Dmitri Polyansky.

Date of the inauguration of the service will be announced later.

### MCNAUGHTON DIES

Gen. A. G. L. McNaughton, 79, a merchant's son who reached Canada's highest military rank and achieved distinction as statesman, scientist and conservationist, died Monday at his summer home in Lovell, Que.

Born in Mosonmagyaróvár, Saks, McNaughton, a privy councillor and former defence minister, was the first Canadian to achieve both the rank of full general and to command a full Canadian army during the Second World War.

He represented Canada at the United Nations when he first served on the Security Council.

### INCREASED BANK RATE

Britain Thursday moved on several fronts to bolster the pound and strengthen the country's balance of payments position.

The most powerful action was an increase in the bank rate to seven per cent from six per cent.

Prime Minister Wilson warned that other austerity measures are planned.

### NATIONALIST WINS

A Welsh Nationalist Thursday night scored the political upset of the year by defeating the ruling Labor party candidate in a by-election in Carmarthen, Wales, for a House of Commons seat.

Gwynfor Evans took the seat away from Labor which had won the seat in the March 31 British general election.

Evans' victory leaves the Commons with 360 Labor members, 253 Conservatives, 12 Liberals, one Republican Labor member, one Welsh Nationalist, and three non-voting members. Speaker and his deputies.

### World Briefs

France Thursday celebrated the 17th anniversary of the storming of the Bastille with military pomp and the high spirits of a carnival. Washington announced Wednesday that two Czechoslovakian diplomats attempted to have a listening device planted in key offices of the U.S. state department building.

United Nations officials said Friday the situation appeared to be calm on the Syrian-Israeli border where explosions and an air battle took place in the last two days.

### ATLANTIC WEEK

Rear Admiral William Landy, Canada's sea operations chief, said he has been fired after he refused to resign and it's only a matter of deciding the date of my departure. The admiral confirmed an Ottawa report about his status. He said his dispute with Defence Minister Hellyer is over the armed forces unification program. The issue is the destruction of the navy's identity through a common rank structure with the other armed forces and a single uniform "without any apparent change in rank or efficiency," he said.

At Trenton, N.J., steelworkers at the Hawker Siddeley (Canada) Ltd. plants voted to accept a new contract which will give them an hourly hike of 6 1/2 cents over a three-year period. Negotiations began last December when the last contract expired. Delay in reaching an agreement prompted walkouts at the Trenton plants and demonstrations in Trenton and neighboring New Glasgow.

The new contract calls for an immediate pay raise for an immediate pay raise of 15 1/2 cents retroactive to Dec. 1.

### ANGRY LIONS STIR TROUBLE

**BRUSSELS (Reuters)** The co-pilot of a chartered plane fought three angry lions with a hatchet in midair today while the pilot steered the aircraft to an emergency landing here.

When the plane landed, the terrified pilots smashed the hatchet and jumped to the runway, leaving the lions snarling behind them.

The lions, being flown from West Germany to London, broke out of their cage while the Swiss-chartered Dair-Herold cargo plane was over Belgium.

Pilot Paul Whithman said the lions' cage was at the back of the fuselage. There was no partition to the cockpits.

As the plane was coming in to land, the two big lions became aggressive and co-pilot Max Schomberger grabbed the plane's safety hatchet to fight them off.

As soon as it taxied to a stop and the pilots squeezed out of the broken window, firemen threw a net over the plane to keep the lions from clawing their way out.

A Dutch woman biologist, Dr. Agathe Geysen, hurriedly summoned from Antwerp 200 miles away, thrust her arm through the cockpit window and lifted the cub out of the plane by its neck. The big ones were left for later disposal.
