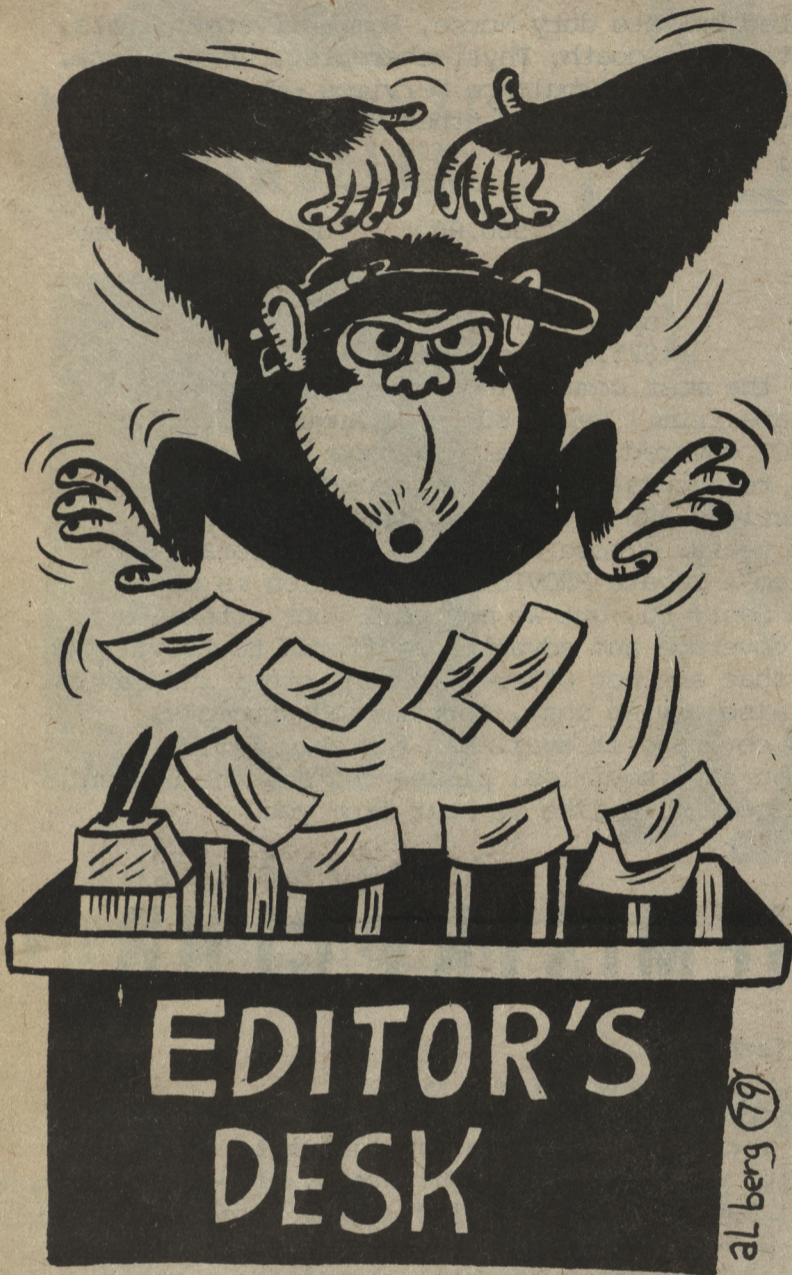


# EDITORIAL

enough high-falutin' talk for now.

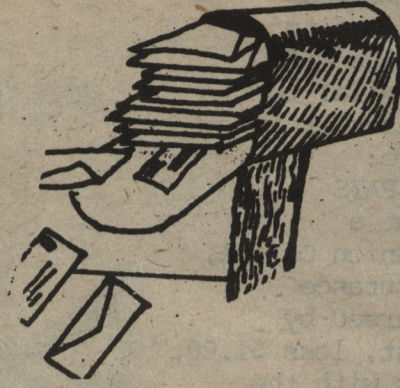
