Ferry Companies Both Report Traffic Increase

Ferries at both the Wood Islands and Borden terminals carried an increased number of passengers and vehicles in October as compared with the same period last year.

During October CNR ferries between Cape Tormentine and Borden carried 38,683 passengers and 17,717 vehicles, 4,148 more passengers and 1,528 more vehicles than last October.

Northernland Ferry Limited carried 1154 more vehicles in October, 1964, and over 3,000 more passengers.

From May to October, Borden Ferries carried 67,471 cars, over 14,000 more than last year, and 10,389 trucks, about 1,300 more than last year.

CNR passenger vehicles showed a sizeable jump from 12,721 in October last year to 14,229 this year. The number of trucks, buses, motorcycles and passenger trailers carried also showed increases. Trucks totalled 1,853; buses 103; motor cycles seven; passenger trailers 75. In addition 1,129 tractor trailers were carried.

Rail passengers showed an increase of 215, or 11 per cent.

Tignish Area Has Sixth Fire

TIGNISH — Fire yesterday destroyed a vacant house here, owned by Max McInnis.

The building, which burned about 3 a.m. yesterday, was the first parochial house in Tignish destroyed in 1964.

The fire was so advanced when discovered that the Tignish Fire Department did not take their equipment to the scene.

The building was the sixth structure, including a house by fire in a six-month period.

Island Protests RCMP Cost Hike

Attorney-General Alban Farmer has protested a provincial government proposal that would boost the province's costs for RCMP services from \$174,550 to over \$328,007.

The federal government wants to raise by about 65 and 75 per cent the RCMP cost to the provinces.

Mr. Farmer, who attended a recent federal-provincial conference on RCMP policing in the provinces, said that all provinces felt that the "proposed increase was out of line." He said the "proposal departs entirely from the intent of having the RCMP as a national police force. The original plan was to have a force that would cost the provinces \$1,000 per man."

The attorney-general said the proposal is very distracting to budgetary matters. "Provincial governments," he said, "are now faced with a large increase in costs at the time when budgets are being prepared for the next fiscal year."

Mr. Farmer said representatives of the provinces went to Ottawa with the hope of entering a new contract for RCMP services. He said as a result of the proposed cost hikes no province agreed to a contract.

"The conference," he said, "resumes later this month and I expect to attend."

The federal government also proposed to withdraw the services of RCMP from municipalities that have more than a 5,000 population.

This proposal would not have any effect in this province as Charlottetown and Summerside have their own police forces.

It is reported, however, that British Columbia may create its own police force. That province's attorney-general, Hon. Robert Beaudet, said this may come about if the federal proposals go through.

Art Exhibition Program Announced For Gallery

Moncrieff Williamson, Confederation Art Gallery curator, has announced the program of exhibitions scheduled for the gallery between now and April 5.

A showing containing works which can be shown in only the major galleries of Canada, to the present, will be on exhibition from Nov. 10 to Dec. 15. The works are on loan from the National Gallery of Canada.

This will be followed by three shows from Winnipeg, Waterloos of Oskar Laske, regarded as one of the outstanding Viennese artists, drawings of Gustav Klimt, who is usually associated with the Art Nouveau, and experimental paintings by John Kaler, who is regarded by many art authorities in Canada as being one of the most interesting of the expressionist graphic artists at work today, will comprise the showings.

Following is this major exhibition of construction paintings by Eli Borstein, Head of Fine Arts Department, University of Sask., perhaps the only Canadian artist concerned with this type of painting, will be shown. This exhibition comes from Montreal.

It is expected that the gallery will have a show of works by R. York Wilson, Canada's leading muralist, in March.

Glossolalia A Religious Prairie Fire

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — "The words I uttered were above and beyond my own intelligence. It happened three years ago. I had been praying for the experience."

"One day, here in my living room, I was kneeling in prayer. Suddenly I had a feeling of great and unbridled joy. I began to praise God in English and then changed to another language. It was a beautiful experience."

The speaker is Vivian Bruner of Dallas. She is a Baptist. She takes part in one of the most controversial activities in Christianity today: Glossolalia.

Glossolalia means "gift of tongues," which Webster's Third New International dictionary defines as "Ecclesiastical speech that is usually unintelligible to hearers and is uttered in worship services of various contemporary religious groups laying great stress on religious and emotional fervor."

Proponents see it as a religious prairie fire sweeping the grass roots of American religion. They say they hope it will breathe new life and vitality into what they call "the cold and sterile" church.

Many church leaders differ. They fear that growth of Glossolalia could deal great harm to organized forms of American religion. They say it is because of its dividing nature.

It is related in the New Testament in the Book of Acts, chapter 2, when the Apostles gathered at Jerusalem 50 days after Easter.

"And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place."

"And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the house where they were sitting."

"And there appeared unto them cloven tongues of fire, and it sat upon each of them."

"And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with one another, as the Spirit gave them utterance."

Speaking with tongues has been a characteristic of the Pentecostal movement since it sprang up shortly after 1900.

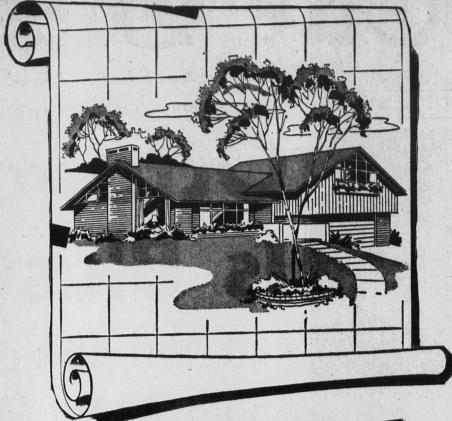
Some ministers who believe the blessings of the Holy Spirit permit them to speak in tongues heal and have visions.

In the last five years, the practice appeared in some Baptist, Presbyterian and Episcopal churches.

Some ministers of non-Pentecostal churches who have practiced and condoned speaking in tongues have resigned under fire from congregation members.

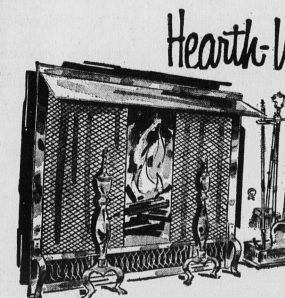

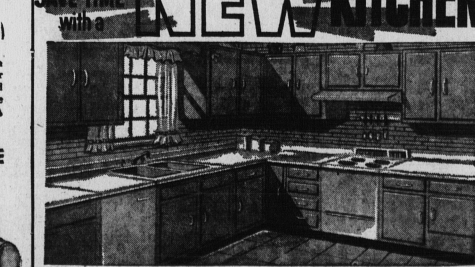
