

Canada's Economy Expected To Hold Expansion In 1966

TORONTO (CP)—There is every indication the Canadian economy will continue to expand well into 1966, although some inflationary pressures are showing, the Canadian Chamber of Commerce was told today.

The opening session of the chamber's 36th annual meeting was told by its General Manager, D. L. Morrell of Montreal, the country's current expansion still is reasonably well

balanced, both geographically and economically.

"In both Canada and the United States the forces making for expansion still dominate the outlook and give every indication of doing so well into 1966," Mr. Morrell said in his review of business conditions.

Capital spending by business, buoyed by record total earnings in 1964, has been the greatest factor in this year's growth, he said. Construction spending was up 19 per cent compared with 1964 while investment in machinery was up 18 per cent.

Consumer spending also was remaining high "and could give an extra push to business activity if sales of non-durables pick up in the latter part of the year as expected."

Mr. Morrell pinpointed two problems that will be felt in the economy a year from now—the ability of business to continue its investment in new plants and equipment and world trade.

Both these relate directly to costs, he said.

Price increases are eating into company profits "and this is eroding the fund from which capital expenditures are made."

"Cost increases well in excess of productivity gains also weaken Canada's potential ability to retain domestic markets in our relatively exposed economy and an adequate share of a prospective declining volume of world trade."

Thus it was essential to hold the line on costs and prices and to continue policies aimed at increasing domestic industrial production.

About 800 delegates from across Canada are attending

the convention. One of the highlights of the three-day meeting will be a discussion of a national survey conducted by the chamber of people's attitude toward business.

Preliminary reports of the survey have indicated some sharply critical opinions were gathered.

N. R. Crump, chairman of the CPR, will address the closing banquet Wednesday.

Bathing Suit Is Garb Used In Cold Test

TORONTO (CP)—What would you do, sitting in a temperature of 50 degrees wearing only a bathing suit, with nothing to do? Shiver probably. But that's the object of the experiment.

Dr. Frank Girling and a team of scientists of the defence medical research laboratory here are trying to find out how people acclimatize themselves to cold.

so tightly they become almost rigid.

"One factor has stood out," he said. "The subjects who shiver the least do not breathe quickly during the exposure to cold."

"We plan to train our subjects to control their rate of breathing and then measure their reactions to see whether the response to cold is changed."

"There are plenty of practical incentives for man's becoming better used to cold and so needing less bulky clothing in northern Canada. And it's quite possible."

"The average temperature of a Japanese home is 48 degrees, yet they are comfortable," says Dr. Girling, "and the Canadian Eskimo is one of the healthiest races in the world."

A party of eight volunteers sit in the 50-degree room for one hour a month so that their shivers can be studied.

It has been discovered that there are many shivering patterns, says Dr. Girling. Some people merely shake a little while others tense their muscles
