Newark, Del. Man Wins Canadian Golf Title

W. R. WHEATLEY Canadian Press Staff Writer TORONTO (CP)—Dave Douglas of Newark, Del., coming from behind with a dazzling last-round 65, won the Canadian open golf title Saturday with a 72-hole score of 273, one stroke better than Wally Ulrich of Austin, Minn.

The tall, lanky Delawarean, who teurs the tournament trail summer and winter, overcame Ulrich's four-score lead in the final round, spinning off three birdies at the last three holes. He finished off his string with two marvelous shots at the 18th, leaving him a four foot putt which he sank.

Douglas' medal score was 273, made up of 68-70-69-66 against the Scarborough course par of 71, was 11 strokes under par for the full distance.

A double bogey six at the 15th by Ulrich virtually ruined his chances for first place and cost him a difference between the winner's \$3,000 and the runner-up's \$1,500.

Douglas holds the Seagram Gold Cup for a year. He was "very happy" with the victory and said he would return to defend his title at Vancouver Point Grey in 1954.

E. J. Dutch Harrison of Ardmore, Okla., Canadian open winner in 1949, was only two strokes behind Ulrich going into the final round. So was Marty Furgol of Lemont, Ill. Neither could keep pace with Douglas' sensational comeback.

Harrison matched Ulrich's par 71 in the last round to win third place and \$1,200 with his 276. Furgol took a 75 and dropped to ninth place with 280.

Pat Fletcher of Saskatoon and Garner Dickinson of Panama City, Fla., tied for fourth place at 277 and collected 900 each. Pat also won \$200 and the Rivermead Trophy as low Canadian. Tommy Bolt of Houston, Texas, was fifth with 278, worth \$500.
