

R. J. Reynolds, Wife Settle Divorce Battle

ATLANTA (AP)—Wesley R. Reynolds and his Canadian-born third wife settled their bitter, four-year divorce fight Saturday in a surprising agreement that gave Mrs. Reynolds more than \$2,000,000 in alimony and legally severed their marriage.

The settlement came nearly one year after a second jury verdict had given Reynolds a divorce and denied Mrs. Reynolds any alimony or lawyers' fees. An appeal of the divorce verdict was withdrawn as her part of the bargain.

The tobacco fortune heir is not well and "his physical well-being requires that he be brought to litigation between the couple," said his lawyer, Wil-

Iam H. Schroder Jr. of Atlanta. His third wife, Marie Mars Reynolds of New York and formerly of Toronto, got a cash payment of \$500,000 and will get \$60,000 a year over the next 20 years. She already had received payments of \$90,000 and \$177,500 under court orders.

Under the agreement, Reynolds, 44, and his partners received \$500,000 for legal services.

Reynolds, 57, also agreed to keep intact a \$1,000,000 trust fund established in a Winnipeg bank in favor of Mrs. Reynolds and her mother from which they receive about \$32,000 annually for life.

Reynolds and his third wife lived together seven years in half a dozen homes he maintained. He filed for divorce in August, 1959, while Mrs. Reynolds was visiting in Paris. He charged her with cruelty.
