# Campanella Cheerful But Progress Is Very Slow

GLEN COVE, N.Y. (AP) — Roy Campanella's progress is agonizingly slow but his morale is high. That's the condition of the burly catcher nearly 2 1/2 months after his brush with death in an auto accident near his home here. Still paralyzed from the lower abdomen down, the 36-year-old Dodger great lies strapped to a turning rack in his bed. A tube is still in his throat to help his respiration. A bulletin issued Thursday by Community Hospital — the first

since March 7 — said Roy's general condition has remained the same since the last bulletin. Although he cannot move his fingers he still has slight movement in his wrists and can extend his arms. Bending at the elbow is good as are most shoulder movements.

"His sense of feeling is at the lower abdomen level. His medical condition is satisfactory." "His morale remains excellent and he listens to every baseball game that is being broadcast."
