## Kosher Meat Salesman Also Ham TV Operator

MONTREAL (CP)—Like millions of other work-weary people at the end of a day, Charles Coorsh likes to turn on television when he gets home from the office.  
But for him switching on means sending signals, not receiving them.  
Mr. Coorsh, whose business is smoked meat, is an amateur television operator and the basement of his home is the scene of his nightly transmissions.  
"I've got an almost insatiable curiosity when it comes to electronics," said the big, ebullient Montrealeur who brightly animated face makes him look every inch the TV performer.  
It was his curiosity that led him into television experiments after five years of earnest dabbling in amateur radio.  
Mr. Coorsh, 44, went into the family meat business in 1938 after graduating in general mechanics at Montreal Technical School.

"ham", Mr. Coorsh became a licensed "ham" in 1956 and operates an amateur television station in his basement. An

He became a licensed "ham" in 1956 and so joined what he calls "a big world-wide fraternity" of amateur television operators. But first and foremost he is a TV amateur.  
"That's why you don't get many television amateurs who get too complicated and some people think the equipment would be too expensive," said Mr. Coorsh.  
After he descends into his wood-lined basement and puts his 75-watt equipment on the air, Mr. Coorsh usually ends up transmitting pictures of himself and any friends who might drop by.  
Since 1961, his ham license, issued by the transport department, has permitted him to operate on TV channel 14, but sets must be equipped with a converter to be able to tune in on his offerings.  
Most receivers are equipped to bring in Very High Frequency (VHF) transmissions, ranging from channels one to 13, but not the Ultra-High Frequency (UHF) band which starts at Mr. Coorsh's airwaves address.  
Thus few people can hear or see him as he tinkers with his transmitter, 5½ feet high by 19 inches in width, and manoeuvres his two cameras on their wheeled stands.  
The metal stands came as a gift from a firm supplying material to the meat plant.

## Warns School Lunches Not A Stop-Gap Meal

OTTAWA (CP)—The home economists in the consumer section of the federal agricultural department warn mothers that lunch is not just a stop-gap meal to fill a child until he can get a proper dinner.  
The economists say lunch should supply one-third of the day's food requirements.  
"Your child's school lunch box should contain food from these four main groups:  
1. Protein food: Meat, fish, poultry, eggs, cheese, peanut butter, dried peas or beans.  
2. Bread and butter: Enriched, whole wheat, rye, rolls, muffins, biscuits, etc.  
3. Fruit or vegetables: Raw, in salads, cooked or canned.  
4. Milk: To drink or eat puddings, soups, cakes, etc."  
Desserts and extras may be included if tastes and appetites indicate they are needed. Extras should not, however, take the place of the basic lunch outlined, say the home economists.

of the leaf with each other. Use softened butter and spread all slices first, then place a spoonful of filling in the middle of each slice down one row of slices, skip the next row, and so on. Now spread the filling on the bread and top with sliced, soft buttered slice. Cut into sandwich-sized pieces.  
TRY NEW SHAPES  
The home economists have a number of imaginative suggestions for brightening up school lunches. They suggest you vary the type of bread and fillings used in sandwiches to avoid monotony.  
Try cutting the sandwiches new and different shapes: fingers, triangles and wedges.  
Include hot foods often. Fill a wide-mouth thermos bottle with hot stew, macaroni and cheese, or soup.  
Tuck in an occasional surprise—a favorite dessert, a few dates, raisins, nuts, or fruit.  
The economists have dreamed up some unusual lunch box treats for you to try. A few examples:  
—Nut bread and red currant jelly sandwiches cut in fingers.  
—Tuna and apple salad in a thermos bottle.  
—A plastic cup of home-made mustard pickles tucked alongside corned-beef-on-rye sandwiches.  
—Crisp barbecued beans topped with chili sauce, along with thick slices of Boston brown bread.  
—Crisp celery stalks stuffed with a blue cheese spread to munch with ham on a bun.  
—Tuna and apple salad in a plastic cup with fitted lid, tomato, water, buttered raisins, and potato chips.  
—Ham spread with cream cheese and rolled, skewered with toothpicks and topped with parsley, to eat with deviled eggs pressed together like a sandwich and wrapped in lettuce.

Here are some tips about how to do the work of the daily task of packing your child's lunch.  
First, have a lunch box cover. A shelf near the bread box is a good spot. Stack it with waxed paper, small empty jars with lids, sharp knives, dishes for making fillings in, sandwich bags, plastic containers, lunch box and thermos bottle.  
Prepare sandwiches ahead— if you have a freezer or a freezer compartment in your refrigerator you can store sandwiches easily; up to a month in the freezer, or a week in the refrigerator freezer. Transfer the frozen sandwiches to the lunch box in the morning. They will help keep the other foods cold and will be thawed by noon.  
Arrange sandwich-making on an assembly-line basis—line up bread slices in equal rows, line up the ingredients, slices of
