

Compound Water Cyclone Has New Uses In Mining

By DON MacLACHLAN EDMONTON (CP) - With a space-age version of the prospector's pan and sluice box, miners now can recover gold that once defied extraction methods.

The means is the Compound Water Cyclone, originally developed in Alberta by Dr. Jan Visman of the federal mines department for removing shale and other impurities from coal.

But, says Dr. Visman, the cyclone can handle finer water-soluble materials than the pan or sluice box and thus gives higher recovery rates where fine gold particles are heavily imbedded in rock.

INCREASE YIELD Its first application to gold mining, at a three-man mine near Yellowknife, N.W.T., resulted in "considerably higher" recovery over a two-year period than conventional methods.

Dr. Visman adds: "A lot of gold is left in the tailing dumps that is of small size and used to be washed up and out with the water and lost in the sluice box method. It could be reclaimed by a cyclone."

The cyclone has been commercially developed and marketed by Cyclone Engineering
