The Prince County baseball league had a preliminary get-together at the Legion home Wednesday night with Tim McGugin in the chair.

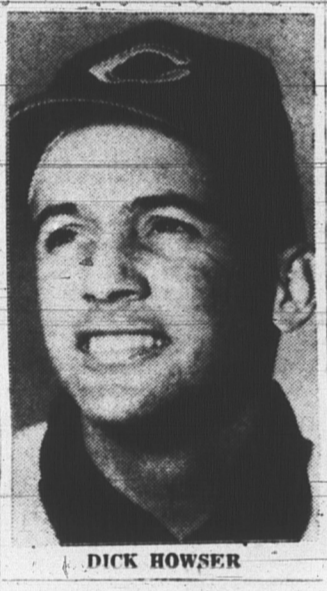

Habs Retain Stanley Cup; Crozier Named Top Player

By BOB TRIMBEE DETROIT (CP)—Henri Richard's goal at 2:20 of overtime gave Montreal Canadiens a 3-2 victory over Detroit Red Wings and their second consecutive Stanley Cup championship Thursday night.

Richard scored for Montreal while Norm Ullman and Floyd Smith replied for Wings.

Montreal never trailed in the game, a tremendous exhibition of skating and hitting and held period margins of 1-0 and 2-1 before Smith got the tying goal mid-way through the final period.

Wings, encouraged by a capacity crowd of 15,154, almost won the game in the dying seconds of regulation time, as Gordie Howe blasted a wicked shot toward the lower left corner.
