THE attention of Captains of Volunteer Militia, to whom Arms have been issued, is called to the very serious obligation they have entered into by their Bonds, "not to allow the same, while under their charge and control, to be used for any unlawful and improper purpose."

Arms and accoutrements are entrusted to the Volunteer Militia for strictly Military purposes; and any member of the Force making use of either on any occasion but that of duty, renders the Officers of the Company to which he belongs liable to the forfeiture of the full amount of the Bond they have signed; and any violation of this obligation will ensure strict enforcement of the penalty thereby incurred.
