Negro Comedian Plans Visit To Prison Camp Americans

NEW YORK (AP) - Negro comedian Dick Gregory said here he hopes to entertain American prisoners of war in North Viet Nam as a "human being—not as a patriot or as an American."

In an interview at Kennedy Airport, the comedian said he is going to Hanoi via London and Paris to try to arrange for a Christmas visit with captured Americans.

Gregory, who said he is "against killing," said that while in North Viet Nam he will not discuss politics or "talk about peace—that is not my role."

He said he has informed the U.S. state department about his intention to go to North Viet Nam and said the department sent a reply Sunday to his home in Chicago.

He said the telegram simply advised him about "two points of law" and he said that since he is unfamiliar with legal matters he does not know whether the state department approved the trip or not.

Asked whether there is a possibility that the state department will lift his passport, Gregory said: "I really don't know. If I have to go to jail a few days or lose my passport, it will be worth it."

In Washington, state department press officer Robert J. McCloskey said the department's reply informed Gregory that "travel to, in or through" restricted countries (North Viet Nam, mainland China, North Korea, Albania and Cuba) without a passport validated for such travel was grounds for revocation of the passport.

About 50 travellers have received U.S. approval to go to Hanoi because their visits were considered in the U.S. national interest. But Gregory has not requested such permission.

ELDERLY PAIR SAVE FRIEND

TORONTO (CP) - Two elderly women, one of them 97, carried another to safety early Tuesday when fire destroyed their bungalow.

Mrs. Charlotte Walker, 97, saw a flare in the next room when Mrs. Gertrude Walker, 87, lit a match to see what time it was. The head flew off the match and landed in a box of tissue paper.

Mrs. Walker helped Mrs. Maude Seymour, 64, carry her sister, Mrs. Baker, outside as the fire spread to the rest of the house.

"We had to shove her out. She broke her hip two years ago," said Mrs. Seymour.
