Marciano May Not Defend Title Again This Year

HOLLAND, Mich., (AP)—Heavyweight champion Rocky Marciano may not defend his title again this year if he whips Joe Walcott in Chicago May 15. His manager, Al Weill, isn't saying exactly that, but some of the things he is saying add up to just about that.

Since training resumed here after a three-week rest for Rocky's injured nose, Weill has shown indifference about the champion's next opponent.

Will it be Ezzard Charles, or Roland LaStarza? Weill was asked. He replied: "Charles, maybe, but on the other hand, maybe Charles and LaStarza would like to fight each other." He added: "We're thinking of going to the Pacific if Rocky wins. Honolulu, Guam, Manila, Tokyo. I got a telegram last week from a fellow in Manila who mentioned \$20,000 for an exhibition there with one of our sparring partners."
