Flour Mill Construction Is Scheduled For Halifax

By DON ANGUS HALIFAX (CP) — Construction of a four-storey flour mill and a 1,000,000-bushel addition to grain facilities in this port city were announced here Wednesday.

While the main production will be bakery and household flour, using Western Canadian wheat, Mrs. Binnie said, "it is hoped that in the near future in co-operation with the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture and marketing, we will be able to utilize Maritime-grown soft wheat suitable for the production of cake and pastry flour."

J.W.E. Mingo, chairman of the port of Halifax commission, said in an interview he welcomed the addition because it was "better than nothing," although he indicated Halifax still required increased storage facilities.

Projects Intertwined

The projects are intertwined with the Dover Plant to be located on NHB property behind present grain and cold storage facilities. Industrial Estates Ltd. the industry-promotion arm of the Nova Scotia government, is assisting construction of the mill by first mortgage bond financing, president, Frank Sobey said.

Total investment by the three parties — Dover, Iel and the NHB — is an estimated \$5,000,000, although a further breakdown in costs of investment and construction was not disclosed.

Mrs. Binnie said the mill will be the first in the Atlantic provinces and one of the most modern in the world. It will process 7,000 bushels of grain daily, producing about 150 tons of flour and 55 tons of mill feed.

A public meeting is set for tonight at the Knights of Columbus Hall here at 8:30 p.m. which it is hoped, will be attended by representatives from government, clergy and contractors.

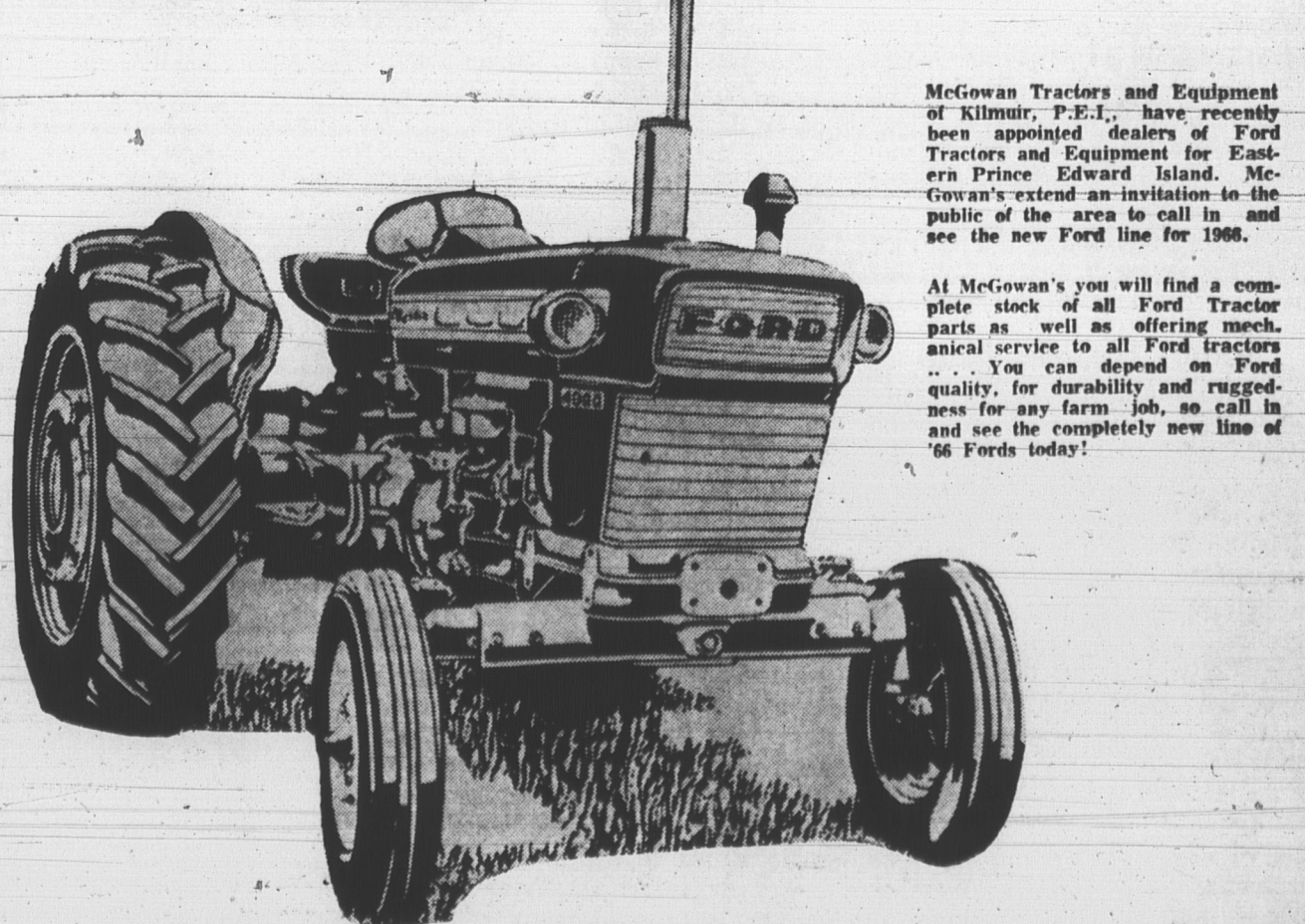
