

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. W. FREEMAN LESLIE

The ranks of the older generation of St. Peter's suffered a distinct loss on Friday, August 28, in the passing of Florence, beloved wife of W. Freeman Leslie in her 76th year.

Although in poor health for some time, she suffered patiently; during which she was tenderly cared for by her daughter-in-law, husband and other members of the family. Her pastor, Rev. W. V. McDonald, visited her frequently during her illness, and was present to perform the last Rites of the Church as the end was drawing nigh.

Her social life was centered mostly around her own home, and it is there she will be longest and most sadly missed. "And the greatest of these is Charity;" then her reward should be abundant. Never spectacular in her acts, yet one cannot but remember the many aged persons who found shelter and comfort in her home before social security was available, and the needy and unfortunate who received many unlisted donations from her hand.

As telephone operator at St. Peter's, a position she filled with satisfaction to all for forty years, she saw this Central grow from one or two subscribers to one of the largest rural exchanges in the Province; and her familiar "Hello" will be greatly missed by the many parties whom she connected in social or business conversations.

From the time her remains were returned from the Charlottetown Funeral Home on Saturday afternoon, until her funeral on Monday morning a constant flow of neighbors and friends from all parts of the Province came to extend their sympathy and say a prayer for the repose of her soul.

Her funeral to St. Peter's Church was one of the largest seen here in years. Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by Rev. Owen Sharkey, assisted by Rev. Wilfred Keefe as Deacon and Rev. George McDonald as sub-Deacon. Rev. J. P. E. O'Hanley was Master of Ceremonies. Seated in the Sanctuary were Rev. R. J. McDonald and Rev. W. V. McDonald. Services at the grave were conducted by Rev. Owen Sharkey. The large number of Mass Cards, messages of sympathy and floral tributes received, show the esteem in which she and her family are held.

Besides her husband, she leaves the following to cherish her memory, William and Joseph at home, George in New York, a daughter, Mary, predeceased her in childhood. One sister, Mrs. Maisie Smith, of Somerville, Mass., and one brother, Peter Larkin of Monticello, New York. Another brother, Rev. William E. Larkin of La Junta, Colorado, passed away eleven years ago.

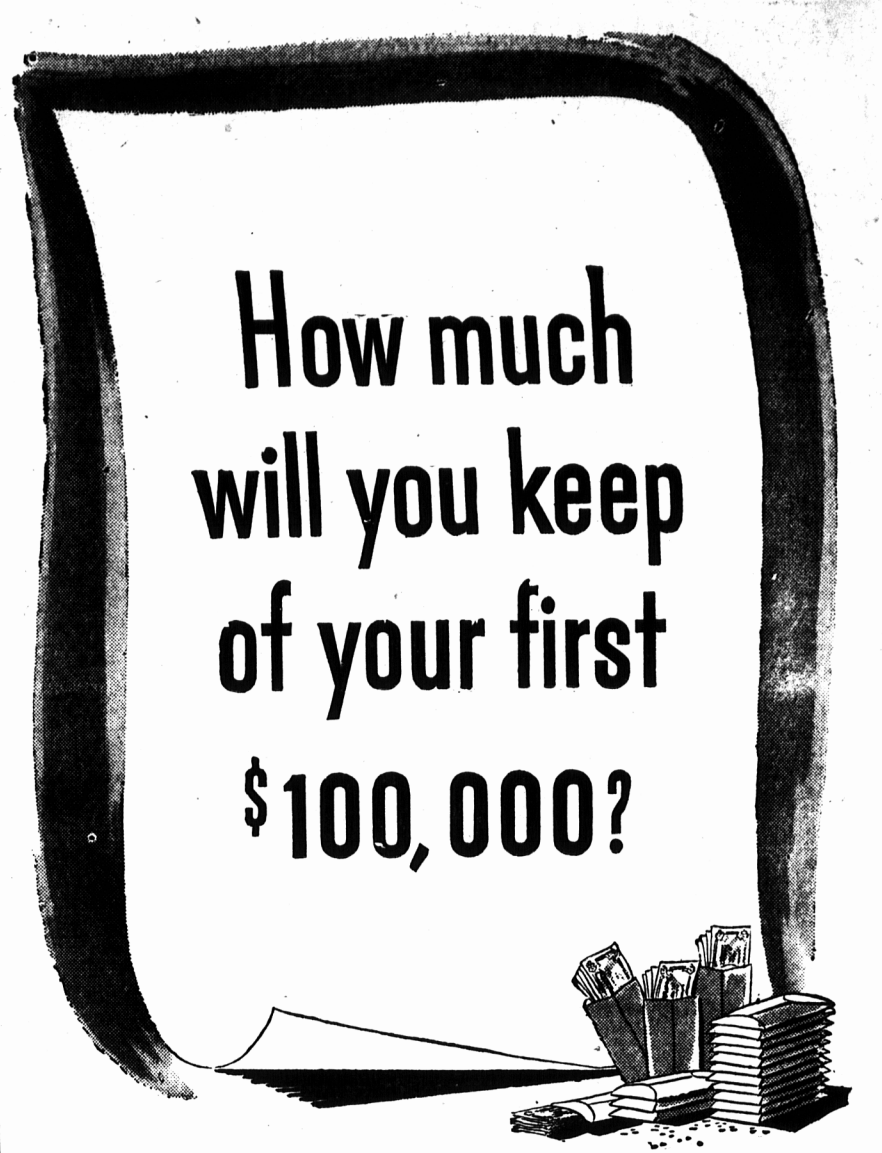

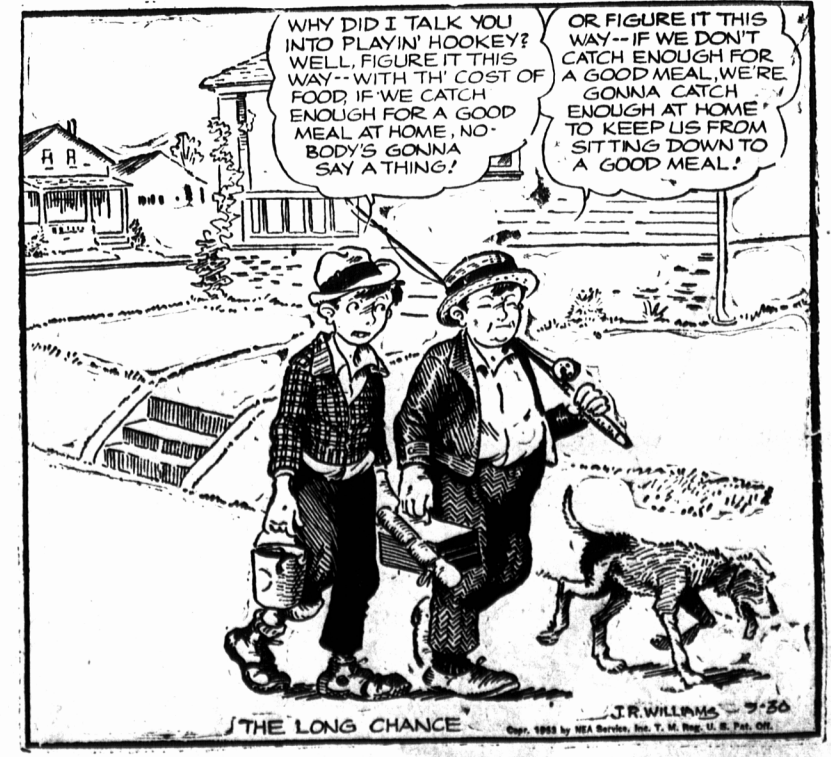
