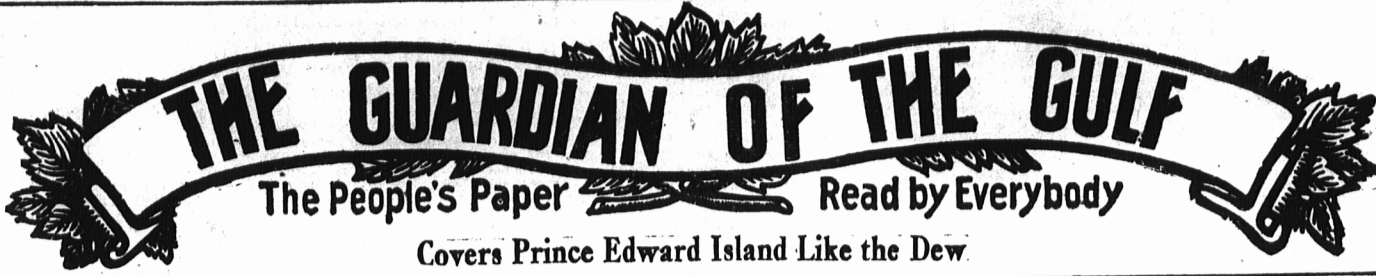

Britain-U.S. To Confer On New Plan Aimed At Settling Iranian Crisis

By John M. Highower WASHINGTON, Aug. 10 (AP)—Britain and the United States will seek a new approach to the Iranian crisis in consultations beginning Monday or Tuesday on Iranian Premier Mohammed Mossadegh's latest proposal for oil negotiations with Britain.

London-Colombo Jet Service To Begin
