Icy Rain, Wind And Snow
Winter Lashes Southern Europe

LONDON (AP) — Winter lashed parts of southern Europe with icy rain, wind and snow Friday as flooding rivers and biting temperatures plagued wide areas of the British Isles.

In Dublin, swamped earlier in the week with its worst flood in living memory, thousands of housewives, shopkeepers, and relief workers were busy with cleanup and rehabilitation chores.

Sections of France, Italy and Switzerland were in the path of the new winter fury. The Irish midlands, Wales and England had continuing flood troubles.

SQUALLS HIT LINER

The 81,000-ton liner Queen Mary landed 844 passengers at Southampton Friday after riding out earlier in the week Atlantic squalls. The liner was hit by a gale force wind and three feet deep rain swelled several small rivers to flood stage.

Switzerland—More than four feet of snow fell in the central Alps and Ticino Canton during the last 24 hours. Winter's first avalanche warning was issued by the Swiss weather service as trees collapsing under the weight of snow blocked roads and rail lines and cut telephone wires.
