CONTRACT BRIDGE

West dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

North
♠ A 7 3
♥ Q 10 9 8

East

The bidding:
East South West North
Pass 1NT Pass 3NT

Opening lead—five of spades.

A good defensive player will maintain his interest in a deal even though he is dealt a poor hand and the bidding does not seem to offer his side very much hope.

West was on lead against three notrump and could see no great future to opening either of his four-card suits. He decided that the best possibility of defeating the contract was to try to find his partner with a long suit. Accordingly, he led the five of spades.

Declarer played the jack from dummy and won East's queen with the king. He then took the diamond finesse and lost to the king. Back came a spade, ducked

in dummy, and another spade, taken by the ace. South had eight tricks available. When he finished running the diamonds, he led a club. East promptly took the ace, cashed his good spades, and declarer went down one, losing three spades, a diamond, and a club.

With all due credit to West for choosing the only lead that could give declarer any trouble, we must still charge South with digging his own grave on the very first play. The contract was absolutely certain to make regardless of how the opponents' cards were divided, provided he played a low spade from dummy instead of the jack.

Declarer suffered from the delusion that he was getting a free finesse by putting up the jack. Instead, he should have maintained the A-J position in dummy so that if the diamond finesse lost, East would not be in position to continue the attack in spades.

South had little to gain and much to lose by playing the jack. He should reason that by playing the deuce from dummy and finessing the diamond immediately, he brings himself to eight winners even if the finesse loses.

With East then on lead and d spades still doubly stopped, no return could possibly jeopardize the contract. The ace of clubs could be forced out to assure ten tricks.

Prison Planned For Springhill

VANCOUVER (CP)—The government plans to build a minimum-to-medium security federal prison at Springhill, N.S., as a satellite of the existing penitentiary at Dorchester in neighboring New Brunswick, Justice Minister Fulton said Monday.

The new institution at Springhill will be used to hold carefully selected prisoners from Dorchester, he said in a speech to the Canadian Congress of Corrections meeting here.

Mr. Fulton announced some time ago that the government planned to build a new institution at the mining town where 75 coal miners died in a cave-in last year. But this was the first indication that the government has reached a decision as to the type of institution it will build.

RELIEVE CROWDING

He said Dorchester Penitentiary will remain the reception centre for prisoners sentenced in the Maritimes area. But the new Springhill institution — evidently with facilities for keeping prisoners outside walls and under a minimum of close security — would help relieve crowding at Dorchester.

He said the new institution would be only about 30 miles from Dorchester.

Referring to other penal plans of the government, Mr. Fulton also disclosed that consideration is being given to expanding the recently-created four-man parole board.

"The government now has under consideration proposals for an increase in trained personnel and the opening of new regional offices" of the board, he said.

The statements were included in a text of the speech issued to the press.

Plan On Berlin Is Complicated

GENEVA (AP) — Communist East Germany's delegation at the Geneva conference is dangle before the Western foreign ministers a complicated plan to end the Berlin crisis.

A Western official said Monday the plan calls for:
1. Acceptance by the West of the theory of East German rather than Soviet control of the land and air arteries linking isolated West Berlin with West Germany. To meet the Western powers' objections to a compact that might imply diplomatic recognition of the Red regime, this would not be spelled out in a written agreement.

2. A certain number of daily flights by Western military aircraft to supply U.S., British and French garrisons in West Berlin. The Allies now have the right to
