POSITIONS OPEN

Have you ever wondered how those powerful and prestigious committee chairmen come by their jobs? Well, the mystery is about to be solved.

Students interested in the chairship of any Student Union committee are required to give their name to the Internal Vice-President, Connie Cullen. (A thought I wish someone would change the name of that position. It sounds like she's in charge of kidneys and livers) The applications for each position are then passed to a five member selection committee. The five members? Jim Ross and Brian Zalewski, both Student Council members; Christine Rolason, a Senior education student; and a student appointed by the committee being considered (for example if the chairmanship of the Winter Carnival Committee is being discussed, the Winter Carnival Committee appoints one of its members to the screening committee). 
