MONTREAL (CP) - The U.S. dollar Wednesday closed at a discount of 1 31-32 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 5-32. Pound sterling \$2.76, down 3/8.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) - The stock market Wednesday had trouble deciding which way to go and at the close it was mixed with a majority of issues on the downside.

Base metals and western oils all had minor index-losses but each section had a few fair-sized gains sprinkled through a list of narrow losses. Golds, with Dome Mines gaining 3/4 at 13 1/2, recorded an index-gain of three-quarters of a point.

New Mylmaque, for the fourth straight day, was the most-active stock on the board, trading 881,993 shares while losing 6 1/2 cents to 23 1/2.

Senior base metals lost fractional ground while low priced mines had a majority of declines in narrow-range trading.

Western oils were featured by American Leduc, down five cents to 29 cents amid a volume of 102,000 shares.

MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) - Prices were mixed to lower in moderate trading Wednesday on the Montreal and Canadian Stock Exchanges.

Winnipeg and Central Gas held the spotlight, declining \$3.70 to \$3.30. It touched a new low of 3.25 during the day. Other utilities were mostly fractionally easier.

Refining oils were generally lower. International Petroleum dropped a point to 35 1/4.

Base metal, construction, stocks and miscellaneous beverages were mixed. Canadian Breweries advanced 1/4 to 27 1/4. Ogilvie lost a point at 26 1/2.

Mines and oils were down. Penny issues were generally lower in a six-cent range.

The exchanges' closing averages show banks off .07 at 45.11, utilities off .2 at 133.9, industrials off .2 at 232.7, combined off .2 at 199.8, papers off .38 at 1,061.34 and golds off .43 at 65.19.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - News of lower money rates brought only a brief celebration to the stock market Wednesday. The market pursued an irregular course and ended lower.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 50 cents to \$160.10 with industrials down 80 cents, rails down 70 cents and utilities unchanged.

Volume was 2,390,000 shares compared with 2,160,000 Tuesday.

Among the 15 most active stocks, seven fell, six rose and two were unchanged.

American and Foreign Power was the most active stock, unchanged at 12 1/2 on 97,300 shares. Second was Avco, unchanged at 7 on 48,400 shares. Third was Benguet, up 3/16 at 1 1/2 on 47,500 shares.

Dome Mines led Canadian issues on the New York exchange, gaining 3/8. McIntyre Porcupine rose 1/4. Aluminum Ltd. lost 1/8. Hudson Bay Mining 3/8 and International Nickel 1/8.

Among Canadian issues on the American exchange, Shawinigan gained 1/8. Preston East Dorn lost 1/8 and Brazilian Traction 1/8.
