



Old Age Security Registration Almost Completed On Island

J.E. Green, regional director for the first time in January 1967. To date, 750 applications have been received and almost all have been approved for payment with a few being deferred until the claimed dates of birth can be confirmed.

Mr. Green said that his additional group of pensioners will bring the total annual Old Age Security payment in P.E.I. to approximately \$8,700,000, an increase of almost \$700,000 per year, with a direct saving to

the Provincial Government of the province and at the Regional Office in the Federal Building in Charlottetown.

SEPARATE PROGRAMS
"Apparently there has been some uncertainty regarding the effect of the Canada Pension Plan on Old Age Security payments," Mr. Green said, and he went on to point out that "there is absolutely no connection between the two programs. Any person may draw the Old Age Security pension at age 65 and continue to make contributions under the Canada Pension Plan until age 70 if he wishes to improve his benefit status under that program. In other words, while anyone may retire at age 65 in January and receive whatever benefits are due to him under both programs, it is also possible to apply for the Old Age Security pension only and continue working so as to increase Canada Pension Plan benefits."

Information concerning the Canada Pension Plan may be obtained from the Field Officer, E. J. McCabe, of the Department of National Health and Welfare whose office is in the Federal Building, Charlottetown.
