FURTHER NEWS OF LIBERAL VICTORY

HALIFAX, Nov. 26—The bye-election for the Local Legislature resulted in a sweeping victory for the Government, the Liberal candidates carrying three of the four vacancies. Lunsenburg and Cumberland by large majorities, and Victoria by acclamation, while in Hants—the majority of the late C. S. Wilcox, leader of the Opposition, was reduced from 52 to 27 for Albert Parsons, the Conservative candidate. In this case the result was not definitely known until the last poll had been heard from. The forces of the Conservatives were concentrated on Lunsenburg, where every effort was made to defeat Attorney General McLean. But despite the combined efforts of the Provincial, Halifax and Lunsenburg Tory organizations, under the general ship of A. B. Crosby, M. P. J. W. Margesson, was defeated by a majority of 505.

In Cumberland the contest was a three cornered one between J. F. Livingston, Liberal, T. S. Rogers, Conservative, and A. Landry, Labor. As in Lunsenburg the Liberal candidate greatly increased the majority of the former member, the late Hon. W. T. Pipes. Mr. Livingston's majority over Mr. Rogers was over 300, and over Mr. Landry, the Labor candidate 1700, the latter losing his deposit.

In Hants County the result was not known until the last poll had been heard from, and it was seen that Albert Parsons, the Conserva-

...was elected over W. M. Christie, K. C., by the narrow margin of 27, cutting down the majority of the late member, Mr. Wilcox by 27.

In Victoria A. A. Buchanan, Liberal, was elected by acclamation to fill the vacancy caused by the retirement of John G. Morrison.

In Lunsenburg the Attorney General is returned to Parliament by 505 majority. The weather today was the worst known for years. Many of the older voters and those in poor health were unable to poll their votes. It rained and blew hard all day and the vote polled is very small. The vote was McLean 3232, Margesson 2727.

In Amherst J. H. Livingston, the Liberal candidate, in the three cornered fight, won out by the substantial majority of something over 300. Up to the close of the poll the Opposition felt confident that Mr. Rogers would be returned and even many Liberals, because of the quiet nature of Mr. Livingston's campaign, feared for the result; consequently the victory achieved made the Government supporters very much elated.

In Springhill the Labor candidate made his prediction that he would poll sixty per cent of the total vote. He, however, loses his deposit, polling only 1232 votes which was more than either party had estimated.

CLEMINSON GUILTY

CHICAGO, Nov 27—Dr Haldane Cleminson, who has been on trial for the murder of his wife, Nora Jane Cleminson, was found guilty of murder and sentenced to life imprisonment. It took the jury little more than three hours to reach a verdict.

Cleminson was charged with the murder of his wife, Nora Jane Cleminson, who was found dead in a strong odor of chloroform pervading the room. Cleminson said that he had been unconscious for several hours and that when he recovered he had found his wife dead by his side. He told a story about burglars entering the house and said that fifty dollars and some jewelry had been taken.

COWBOYS TAKE CHARGE OF A NORTH DAKOTA TOWN.

ENGLEVALE, N. D., Nov 27—Two cowboys, last night fatally shot Lou Maxwell, a farmer, took possession of Englevale for twelve hours, and finally departed early today, with armed citizens in pursuit. The cowboys, known as the Gant Brothers, have not been found. In a pool-room fight last night Maxwell was shot by one of the brothers. The Gants, who recently came from Texas to work on a ranch, then took possession of the town. Firing volley after volley with large revolvers, the two paraded the streets and forced everyone to do their bidding until long after midnight. Then they galloped off, much to the relief of the inhabitants. A deputy sheriff and deputies fear trouble when the Gant boys are found.

ST JOHN, Nov 27—James Pender, representative of the St John Board of Trade, at the Chamber of Commerce of the Empire at Sydney, Australia, stated that during an interview that Imperial Preference has made rapid progress in the minds of the people from all sections of the Empire since meeting in Montreal five years previously. At Sydney the idea of a preference trade within the Empire was carried by eight to one. Not only was there majority by a total vote, but when they were polled by the Chambers there was likewise a decisive majority for the measure.
