GANNET ROCK LIGHT HOUSE.

MARINERS are notified that from and after the FIRST day of AUGUST, 1867, the existing FLASH LIGHT on GANNET ROCK, in *Bay of Fundy*, will be replaced by one of the Fourth order Helophotal system. The character of the new Light will be—during each minute—

Fixed White Light,	-	-	45	Seconds.
Eclipse,	-	-	5 $\frac{1}{4}$	"
Flash,	-	-	4 $\frac{1}{2}$	"
Eclipse,	-	-	5 $\frac{1}{4}$	"

60 Seconds.

In consequence of the arrangements to be made for substituting the new apparatus to the old one, and necessary repairs to the Light House, the present Light will cease to be shewn from the night of TUESDAY, the Ninth day of JULY, 1867, until the night of THURSDAY, the First day of AUGUST, 1867, being the time fixed for putting the new light in operation.
