Words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number, and words importing the plural number only shall include the singular number. Words importing the masculine gender only shall include females. The word "Master" shall include as well the Masters in Ordinary as Masters Extraordinary of the Court of Chancery of this Island. The word "Lunatic" shall include Idiots, and persons of unsound mind, whether found such by inquisition or under the provisions of any Statute or not. The word "Guardian" shall mean Father or testamentary Guardian, or Guardian appointed by the Court of Chancery, (not being a special Guardian appointed under the provisions of this Act.
