MP Will Seek Divorce, Birth Control Overhaul

OTTAWA (CP) — A Liberal member of Parliament is planning to seek parliamentary approval for an overhaul of Canada's divorce and birth control laws.

Ian G. Wahn (L—Toronto St. Paul's) has prepared a bill which would broaden grounds for divorce provided "there is no reasonable expectation of a normal marriage relationship."

Mr. Wahn says he plans to introduce this bill, along with the birth-control bill, at this session.

The divorce bill would extend the grounds to cover desertion, cruelty, habitual drunkenness, excessive use of drugs, extended imprisonment, insanity and extended separation. But it would also give the courts more leeway in deciding whether a mar-

riage has a reasonable chance of reconciliation.

No divorces would be permitted within three years of marriage, thus providing an opportunity for reconciliation.

The only ground for divorce in Canada is adultery, except in Nova Scotia where divorces can also be granted for cruelty.

Mr. Wahn's proposed birth-control bill would legalize the termination of pregnancy provided it was done to preserve the physical or mental health of the woman.

The pregnancy of an unmarried girl under 18 could be terminated with the consent of one of her parents. The bill would also legalize the sale of contraceptives, and birth-control instruction. This now is illegal under the criminal code.

Robert Priddy (NDP—Burnaby-Richmond) also has a birth-control bill to be introduced but it is confined to lifting the ban on sale of contraceptives.

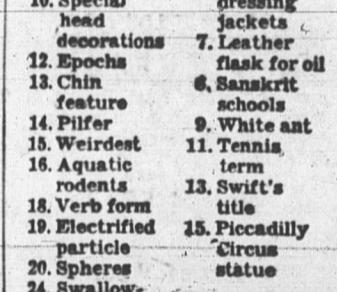

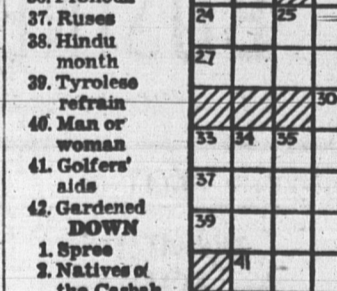

With a 3-3 division, he could make the contact by drawing two more rounds of trumps, cashing the Q-J of clubs, and ruffing a heart to permit the 10-6 of clubs to be cashed. But if the trumps were divided 4-2 and he now cashed the K-Q, he would be unable to get back to his hand to cash the 10-6 of clubs after cashing the Q-J in dummy.

Upon thinking the matter over carefully, Grunewald came to the conclusion that in a hand so freakish the diamonds were far more likely to be divided 4-2 than 3-3 and that desperate measures were therefore in order. Accordingly, he led the king of diamonds, discarding a heart from dummy, and then continued with the Q-J of diamonds, discarding the A-K of spades from dummy.

As a result of this extraordinary method of play, Grunewald made the slam. After cashing the Q-J of clubs, he led the six of spades towards the J-5. East took the queen, but, having only spades left, he was forced to return one to the jack. So Grunewald wound up with twelve tricks consisting of six diamonds, five clubs and a spade.

But if Grunewald had failed to discard the A-K of spades from dummy, he would inevitably have wound up going down one!
