**3rd Prince County Regiment of Militia.**

The following will be the District limits and numerical order of the Officers of the several Companies of the above Regiment :

- No. 1 Company—Capt. Wm. T. Ellis, Lot 12; Lieut. James Ellis, (Wm's. son) do.; Ensign Edward Ellis, do. Precinct of Company—From the line of Lot 11 on both sides of Barlow Road to Barclay's Mill; all on the north side of said mill stream, and Bideford River.
- No. 2—Capt. James Barclay, Lot 12; Lieut. Wm. Ellis, (George's son); Ensign Albert Williams, Lot 12. Precinct—From Barclay's Mill to A. MacLean's; all on the north side of Trout River, Canada Settlement and the road to Robinson's included.

- No. 6—Capt. Murdock McKinnon, Esq., Lot 14; Lieut. John Plasteid, do.; Ensign Ambrose McDonald, do. Precinct—From Plasteid's Mill to Western Road, including all on both sides of road and all down to Grand River Ferry, on the North side of Ellis River to Connors' road.
- No. 7—Captain Alexander Allin, Wellington, Lot 16; Lieut. Archibald McAusland; Ensign John McCormick. Precinct—From the North line of Lot 14 on the Western Road, to Quagmire Bridge, including all on Lot 14 on the West and Lot 16 on the North and South of Ellis River.
- No. 8—Capt. Andrew Campbell (A's son) Lot 16; Lieut. John McLaren, do.; Ensign James Hutchinson, do. Precinct—From Quagmire Bridge all residing on Lot 16 to the line of Lot 17.
- No. 9—Capt. Edwin Darby, Lieut. Sylvang Arsneaux, Ensign John McNally. Precinct—From the rear of Lot 16 line to Duck Rock, including all north residing on Lot 15.
- No. 10—Captain Hugh Gamble, Lieut. William Hibbett, Ensign Alexander Perry. Precinct—From the rear of Lot 16 line to Duck Rock, including all south of the road on Lot 15.
- No. 11—Captain John Baker, Lieut. James Beairsto, Ensign John Cunningham. All from the line between Lots 15 & 17 to Hugh Carr's, including both sides of the road.
- No. 12—Captain Harry Compton, Lieut. Edward Holland, Ensign Dougald Hunt. Precinct—From Hugh Carr, Esq.'s to the Court House in St. Eleanor's, down the Malpeque Road to the line of Lot 19, both sides of the road included.
- No. 13—Captain Benjamin Darby, Lieut. Donald Ramsay, Ensign William Cairns. Precinct—From the Court House to Summer-side, all south, residing on Lot 17 to the line of Lot 19, including Linkletter Road.
