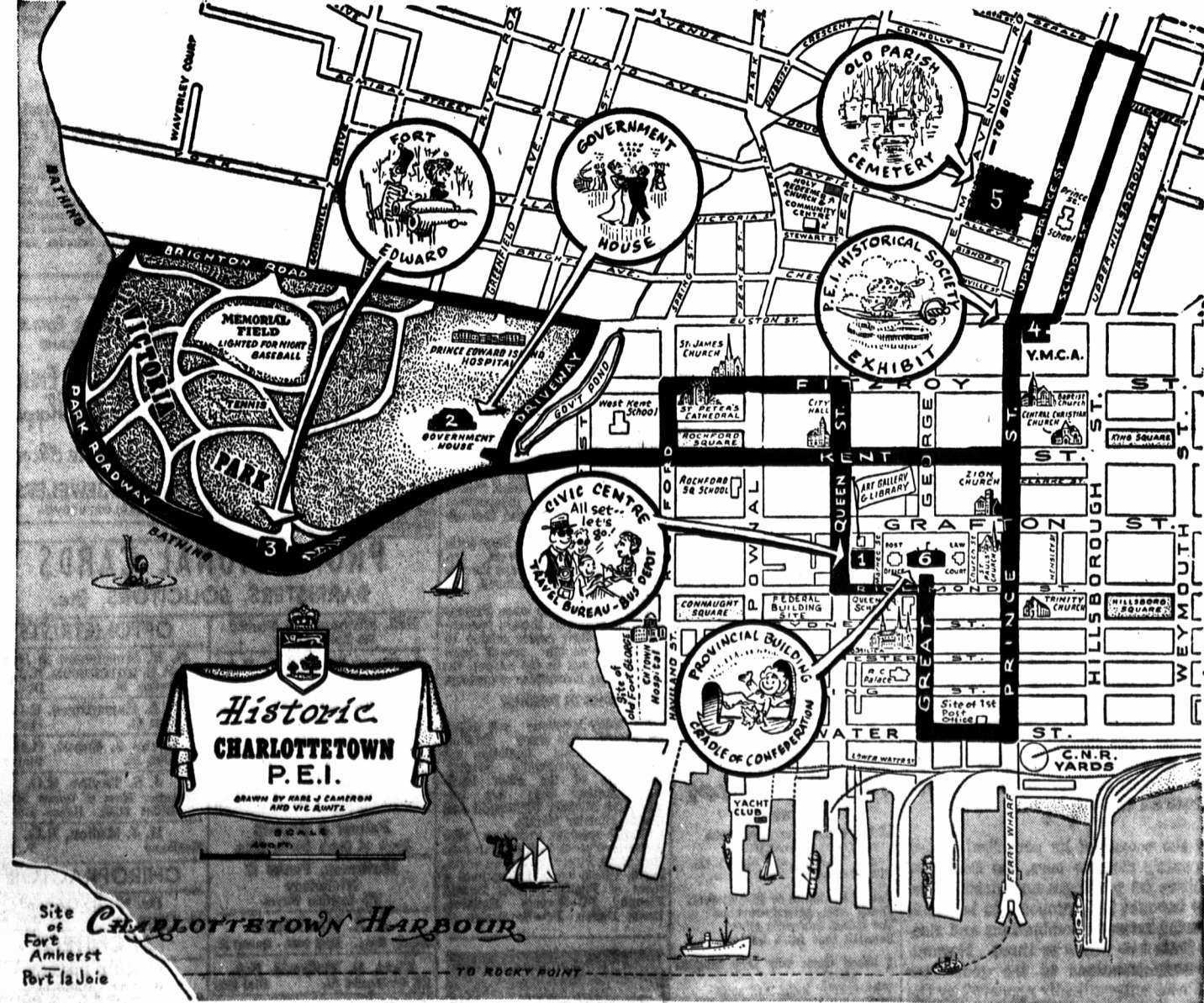

HISTORICAL TOUR OPENS MONDAY



The Charlottetown Centennial Committee is proud to announce the opening of the first guided bus tour of Charlottetown's historical sites. This is the first such tour to be established in the Maritimes. Passengers will board a chartered bus at the Civic Centre and be driven over a carefully selected route to the five sites indicated on the above map. At these points a uniformed guide will conduct the tourists through the premises and inform them of their historical interest. Each tour will last a half hour. En route the bus driver will point out the location of churches and many old landmarks. It is hoped that with the interest and support of the citizens of Charlottetown this tour will be an annual event. So plan now to take advantage of this excursion which will be of interest to our touring guests and educational to all.

See And Hear About OLD CHARLOTTETOWN
1. CIVIC CENTRE, headquarters of the Historic Tour, is located on Queen Street in a lovely old sandstone building which also houses the Provincial Travel Bureau and the I.M.T. Bus Depot. The staff at Tour Headquarters will look after your tour and assist all who wish to know more about where to go and what to do in Charlottetown this year. They will gladly help in finding suitable living accommodations. The office will be open till nine o'clock (Daylight Saving Time) each week-day evening. Phone number at Civic Centre is 9715. Call up and arrange a tour.
2. GOVERNMENT HOUSE is situated at the entrance of beautiful Victoria Park. Now 180 years old, it is the home of the Prince Edward Island representative of Her Gracious Majesty, the Queen. In this fine old mansion many Royal and important visitors have been entertained, including Queen Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh. As you circle the great hall, you may imagine it as the scene of many delightful entertainments and interesting events. Tour visits are by the kind permission of the Lieutenant-Governor, who is in residence. When required for official purposes Government House will not be open. This will be announced, and you are requested to make your visit another day. During tour hours public admission to Government House will be restricted to holders of tour tickets.
3. FORT EDWARD (miniature) MUSEUM was part of the early defences of Charlotte Town. From here you may view and inspect the old guns and earthwork which still remain. The old powder magazine, with its interior rounded ceiling, is now a small museum and houses an unusual collection of Army and Navy equipment of early days.
4. PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND HISTORICAL SOCIETY EXHIBIT is presented in a modern setting in the Charlottetown Y.M.C.A. Our Y. M. C. A. is the oldest established Y.M.C.A. in Canada and you will be interested in its new premises. The exhibit of the Historical Society is a voluntary effort which offers a delightful and interesting presentation of articles used by the early settlers of our Province. There is a small gift shop in the main lobby.
5. THE OLD PARISH CEMETERY, established in the early 1700's, is the resting place of many of those who shaped the history of Canada and Prince Edward Island. There are stones of many unusual types, with unique epitaphs and distinctive lettering, as well as several sarcophagi. The guide has a complete list of the graves and their location.
6. CONFEDERATION CHAMBER in the Provincial Building is the last stop on the Historic Tour. Situated in Queen's Square, this beautiful grey-stone building was the meeting place of the Fathers of Confederation and the birthplace of Canada. The original furniture is placed as used at that meeting, and the addition of many authentic and original Confederation items has made this room the center of Canadian historical interest.
