A TALENTED CLERGYMAN.

Sketch of the Life of a Well-Known Priest.

Father Woods, to whom the following article, which we take from the Redwood, Minn., Gazette, has reference, spent several weeks in Charlottetown last summer, and made a great many friends. During his stay Father Woods preached an able sermon in St. Dunstan's Cathedral.

"Rev. James J. Woods was born in Liverpool, England, and from his earliest days had an intense desire to study for the sacred ministry. He graduated from St. Francis' Jesuit College in his native city when only 14 years of age. His father, the late Mr. Jas. Woods, a well-to-do merchant of Liverpool City, hoping to make his son a successful business man like himself, apprenticed James for seven years in his own offices and stores. But convinced that God had reserved him for a higher and nobler sphere of usefulness, Mr. Woods' elder son proceeded at once to St. Mellary Seminary, in the south of Ireland, where he studied his classics, logic and metaphysics, completing a full five years' course in three and a half years.

He was advanced to the higher studies of theology in 1891, and was ordained a priest forever of the Catholic Church, on June 17th, 1894, by Richard Alphonsus Schachan, Bishop of Waterford and Lismore, in St. John's Cathedral. He sang his first Mass at the Jesuit Church, Liverpool, Sunday, June 24th, and preached his first sermon in St. Augustine's Church, the very church wherein his father and mother were married; where all the children of the family received their first sacraments; lived for 21 years, and in which the young Levite was accustomed to serve Mass from the time he was able to reach up to light the candles in the church.

Coming to St. Paul on Sept. 17, 1894, Bishop Ireland appointed him as assistant pastor of the Cathedral, under Rev. E. R. Heffron, now rector of the seminary. Rev. Father Woods made many close friends during his career at the Cathedral, and in the fall of '97 Bishop Ireland appointed him pastor of Redwood Falls and Sheridan. There was no parochial residence here then, but by dint of energy and perseverance and fairness to all men he succeeded in building the handsome priest's house in Redwood Falls, which stands as a memorial of his labor and honest work. He has lived amongst us for the past three years, and the churches he has built—St. James, Dawson; St. Joseph's, Belview; Our Lady of Victories, Westline; St. Mary's, Searforth and St. Anne's, Wabasso—are the silent monuments that speak better than words of his zeal, energy and perseverance to uplift his coreligionists and of his strife ever and always for the general betterment of his fellow citizens."
