HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor in Council was this day pleased to fix and determine the rate at which the amount of the Invoice of Dutiable Goods, imported into this Island from the United States of America, shall, in estimating the duties payable thereon, be reduced into current money of the Island, as follows:—

In all cases where such Invoices shall be made out in Dollars and Cents of the paper currency of the United States, the amount of such Invoice shall be reduced into current money of this Island, by allowing for each Dollar the sum of **FOUR SHILLINGS AND SIX-PENCE**, and in the like proportion for any fraction of a Dollar; of which all Collectors of Impost are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

An Act for raising a Revenue.

THIS day at five o'clock, p. m., His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor came down to the Council Chamber and assented to the following Bills:—

3. An Act to authorize the Government to raise a Loan of money for the public services of this Island.
4. An Act to amend the Act relating to Land Assessment.

6. An Act to diminish the delay and expense of proceedings in the Court of Chancery in this Island.
7. An Act to enable George C. Stiles to obtain Letters Patent for the invention of a new and useful improvement in the construction of Spinning Wheels.
8. An Act authorizing the establishment of additional Small Debt Courts at Somerset and Montague Bridge and for other purposes.
9. An Act relating to practice and pleading in the Supreme Court.
10. An Act to incorporate the Alberton Masonic Hall Company.
11. An Act for the incorporation of a Flax Company in Prince Edward Island.
12. An Act to amend the Act of 29th Victoria, Cap. 29, relating to Trustees, and the Act relating to judgments in the Supreme Court binding Leaseholds.
13. An Act to incorporate an Hotel Company in Charlottetown.
14. An Act to add to and amend the Act for the regulation of the Militia and Volunteer Forces.
15. An Act in addition to, and to amend the Act for establishing the Prince of Wales' College.
16. An Act to continue certain Acts therein mentioned.
17. An Act to repeal two certain Acts compelling Masters of Vessels to exhibit a Light while in harbor at night-time, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.
18. An Act for appropriating certain monies therein mentioned for the service of the year 1867.
