

Russell Doyle Winner Of 6-Mile Road Race

Slim Russell Doyle, veteran middle distance runner from Charlottetown won the six-mile road race yesterday evening by covering the distance in 36 minutes and 49 seconds.

The Charlottetown runner had little trouble in winning from his two competitors. Second place man Paul Belliveau of Moncton crossed the finish line 39 minutes and 33 seconds after he started and the third place runner Brian Savage of New London covered the distance in 40 minutes and 20 seconds.

For Doyle it was his third race of the afternoon. Earlier he had competed in the mile and half mile events at the Maritime Track and Field meet at Victoria Park.

Young Savage led the early part of the race but Doyle was in the lead at the half way mark. From there on he kept increasing his lead slightly. He crossed the finish line in good condition.

Musial Heads Batting Race By 15 Points

NEW YORK, July 2 (AP)—Stan Musial has moved 15 points in front of the pack in the National Baseball League's batting race as Jackie Robinson's mid-season slump continues.

Averages including Sunday's games show Musial, now back on first base for St. Louis, hitting .366 and Robinson tied for second with Richie Ashburn of the Phils at .351. The Dodger second baseman had only four hits in 20 trips during the week.

Although Musial lengthened his lead, his average also dropped five points on a seven-for-22 pace. Ashburn picked up two points to nudge into a tie with Robinson.
