HUNTER'S CORNER

Pre-Season Fishing Action Leads To Many Complaints

When this column appears in print the trout fishing season will be open for several days. The brooks are running full and clear with no roll and angling should be good. In all my years on the rounds I have never received so many complaints about pre-season trout fishing. The trout taken through the ice at North Lake, so I have been informed, was almost unbeliev-

able. I was told that one old time resident of the district fished every day it was fit, and on some days when it wasn't fit. He and a companion caught 93 trout in a single day and only a few of them were under the pound in weight. It was alleged that the trout were peddled in the district and sold at the top price per pound. A few weeks ago a motorist told me he saw a man fishing at the bridge across Sherry's Creek, the Glenfinnan Bridge near tide water, as unconcerned as if the season had been open for weeks. The same day another motorist informed me that he watched a woman angling at the Covehead Dam as matter of fact as if it was the month of June instead of early April. I inquired as to why no report of the infractions was given to the game officers. None wanted the publicity of going to court and giving evidence and probably having the case adjourned or if there was a conviction the fine would be light. At one time we had a special magistrate who heard Migratory Birds and infractions for all three counties. It was a real pleasure taking

game law offenders to court in my column but I'll pass it on again for the benefit of our young generation of anglers and hunters. On a real winter's day, with a bright sun shining on a snowbound countryside, we approached Scaler Pond and spotted three men angling through holes cut in the ice. Two were full grown men with overcoats down to their heels. The third was a young lad in his early twenties. I spotted the horse and woodsleigh in the woods near the ice. The horse was draped with an array of rugs as it was a real nippy day. There were too many stumps, etc on the pond, that protruded through the ice and Paul brought the plane down in a snow covered field behind the woods that bordered the pond. He then took off and started doing some loops etc. over the ice. The horse whinnied when I came to the sleigh but no one heard him. When I stepped out of the bushes a thick set man in his forties was fishing through a hole in the ice within twenty yards of me. There was about six inches of fluffy snow on the ice and I moved toward him as silently as a cat. The other two, about fifty yards to the right were standing stiff as totem poles watching the scene. Paul was doing a lot of dives in his plane. Just as I got to within a couple of yards from my quarry, who incidentally-unaware of my presence, he made a right turn and plodded over to his companions, who were standing stiff as pokers as if mesmerized. When he got to within a yard of his brother he stopped short and remarked: "I was a right . . . there was only one man in the plane". The answer he got was a dilly: "That's what YOU
