

Princess Talks Eskimo To Patient From N. W. T.

 MONTREAL (CP)—The Princess Royal, who has spoken fluent French during her visit here, Tuesday tried a new language—Eskimo. She was introduced to a 19-year-old Eskimo patient from the Northwest Territories during her tour of the Montreal General Hospital after she declared the building officially open.

Mrs. English, 19, who speaks English, grinned from ear to ear when the princess asked her, "ataa," which means "does it hurt?"

The royal visitor also was shown a one-hour old baby through the window of the nursery. As the princess smiled, the baby yawned.

She was introduced to the infant's mother, Mrs. Louis Charbonneau, 22, of Montreal. The mother said later she would name the baby, her first, Mary after the princess.

After signing the visitors' book in the presence of hospital officials, the eye of the princess was caught by four-year-old Brant Bissell, one of the hundreds of people trying to get a glimpse of her.

She turned to his father, Dr. E. W. Bissell of Manning, Alta., to say, "He's sweet."

A GOLD KEY

The princess, who stopped at the bedside of about a dozen patients, promised Victor Bell, 61, of Montreal that she would pray for his

recovery. He is awaiting an operation for a stomach tumor.

At a ceremony in the nurses' residence, she was presented with a golden key to the hospital as she declared it officially open.

For her round of activities, the princess wore a matching coat and dress of pale turquoise. Her gloves and fitted hat were the same shade.

From the hospital, the princess stopped at the armories of the 11th Signal Regiment of the Royal Canadian Corps of Signals of which she is colonel-in-chief. Although she is making tour as guest of the RCSS, this was her first official meeting with the corps since her visit began.

The princess drew back a Union Jack to unveil a plaque in memory of the officers and men who were killed in battle.

The princess later was guest at a small private dinner in the home of Brig. G. V. White, honorary lieutenant-colonel of the Royal Montreal Regiment.

In the evening, she visited the RMR armories where she was presented with a regimental gold badge set with diamonds and rubies.

The Princess Royal is scheduled today to visit the University of Montreal and drive up Mount Royal with a stop at St. Joseph's Oratory. She will pay a call at St. Justine Hospital and walk through the botanical gardens.

Five Women Sit In On Dominion-Provincial Meet

OTTAWA (CP)—The fathers of confederation probably would do a double-take if they suddenly appeared at one of the closed meetings of the federal-provincial conference.

In 1867 they made history without women at discussions of relations between the federal and provincial governments.

Now, five women sit with the politicians and high-ranking civil servants, observing, taking notes, and passing information to their spokesmen.

"You tend to get the feeling you're sitting in on the making of history," said June Shaley, striking young adviser to Premier Campbell of Manitoba.

"It's interesting to find that history is part of everyday affairs," commented Mrs. Annie Rivkin, an adviser on federal-provincial fiscal problems to Premier Douglas of Saskatchewan.

Two others who are secretaries of provincial premiers—Mrs. Philomena Gregory, secretary of Premier Frost of Ontario and Eleanor McKinnon, secretary of Mr. Douglas—are old conference hands.

They have attended all the conferences since 1945 and say they have enjoyed every one of them.

The fifth woman who has a place among advisers drawn from the municipal level is Ottawa's Mayor Charlotte Whitton.

Miss Shaley, research assistant in the Manitoba treasury department, said in an interview she finds nothing routine about her government job.

"The variety of the work is what makes it interesting," said the young woman who graduated in economics and business administration from the University of Manitoba four years ago.

Mrs. Rivkin, one of three women on the Saskatchewan economic advisory and planning board, said she had been preparing for the conference ever since the premiers of all 10 provinces and Prime Minister St. Laurent met here last April to plan it.

Miss McKinnon, Mr. Douglas' secretary ever since he was elected to office in 1944, remembers the constitutional conference in Quebec of 1950 as the most interesting. It gave her a chance to brush up on her college French.

Now, she makes attempts to talk in French with Joe Boisjoli, the plumber at the legislative buildings at Regina, who drives her to work most mornings in his red truck.
