

Percival To Direct

TORONTO (CP)—Track coach Lloyd Percival of Toronto says he'll direct an Amateur Athletic Union of Canada track meet here Friday despite AAU opposition.

Percival said earlier he intends to sue members of the AAU's Central Ontario registration committee, for libel and slander.

He announced suit following a committee ruling that in effect prevents him from coaching amateurs again. He had been coach of the suburban Don Mills Track Club.

Percival said Tuesday night he definitely will be director of the AAU meet here Friday, Dominion Day.

George Denniston, chairman of the registration committee, said an official will attend the meet to observe whether Percival consorts with any Don Mills athletes. If Percival should conspire with athletes directly, Denniston said, the AAU could withdraw its sanction from the meet and penalize athletes who participate.

Meet secretary George Arnold said "Denniston has never said Percival could not be a meet director and I am not anticipating any AAU action."

Robinson Joins 2 Others In Select All-Star Circle

NEW YORK (AP)—Frank Robinson of Baltimore Orioles joined Jim Bunning and Schoolboy Rowe in the select circle of men picked for both leagues' All-Star teams Wednesday when he was named to the American League starting outfield.

The American League players, managers and coaches voted three right fielders into the starting lineup with their ballots for Robinson, Minnesota's Tony Oliva and Detroit's Al Kaline.

Hank Aaron, who had hit 24 home runs for Atlanta Braves in games through Tuesday, was the top National League vote-getter with 255. Also picked were Willie Mays of San Francisco Giants, 208 votes, and Roberto Clemente of Pittsburgh Pirates, 134.

It was the 13th time Mays has made the team and the 12th each for Kaline and Aaron.

NEW SYSTEM

For the first time, the voters did not have to decide by positions. Previously, a right fielder had to be selected. Players were not permitted to pick their own teammates.

The starting infielders for the July 12 All-Star game at St. Louis were named Tuesday.

The catchers will be announced Sunday and the pitchers and the remainder of the 25-man squads later next week.

Walter Alton of Los Angeles Dodgers will manage the Nationals and Sam Mele of Minnesota Twins will boss the Americans.

Although Oliva and Kaline normally play right field, each

has appeared in centre several times this year. Under the rules the starting players must play three innings, unless injured.

The Nationals wind up with two right fielders in Aaron and Clemente and one centre fielder in Mays.

If the managers follow custom and pick the next three men to complete their outfield contingents, the Americans will have Carl Yastrzemski of Boston, Rick Reichardt of California Angels and Mickey Mantle

back up. Mantle, who has played in 14 All-Star games, received only eight votes.

Willie Stargell of Pittsburgh, Curt Flood of St. Louis and Felipe Alou of Atlanta are the next three in the National voting.

Robinson was on the National League team six times when he was with Cincinnati although not always a starter. Bunning and Rowe, both pitchers, made the team with both Detroit and Philadelphia.

Jerome Set For Trials

VANCOUVER (CP)—Harry Jerome wants his name withdrawn from the list of charter members of the British Columbia sports Hall of Fame.

Jerome, co-holder of the world 100-metre dash record, 10 seconds flat, said Wednesday he has asked his name be dropped as one of 17 outstanding athletes named to the honor roll Tuesday.

"I think it is premature, although I'm flattered," Jerome said.

"I believe I'm the only active amateur competitor on the list, and I wish they had waited until I stop running. I don't think anyone should be put in an institution like that until he is no longer active."

Jerome, who returned Tuesday after giving a running exhibition at a track clinic in Edmonton, said he is "far from retiring," and is looking forward to competing in the Canadian championships in Edmonton later this month.

"The track there is great—really fast," he said.

"I ran the 50-yard dash five times in 5.1 seconds without being pushed."

Jerome is still undecided about competing in the British Empire Games Aug. 4-14 in Jamaica. He has given the pressures of summer courses at university as a reason for his indecision, but has also said he is unhappy that there are not enough meets for pre-BEG preparation.

"You can't get sharp running only one big race a year," he said.

GROSSINGER, N.Y. (AP)—Challenger Joey Archer went through a strenuous 17-round workout, including eight rounds of boxing Wednesday as he

stepped up his preparations for his fight with Emile Griffith. The New York boxing stylist meets the middleweight champion in a title 12-rounder at Madison Square Garden July 13.

Archer boxed three rounds each with Joe Shaw and Carl Williams and two with Canadian Blair Richardson. He hit the speed bag for two rounds, shadow boxed for three and put in four rounds of calisthenics.

He plans several more similar workouts within a week.

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Veteran Bill Daniels and unbeaten Joe Frazier signed Wednesday for a July 25 heavyweight fight in Convention Hall, promoter Herman Taylor announced.

Frazier, the 1964 Olympic champion, has won 10 straight since turning pro, all by knockouts. Daniels has met most of the top fighters in the division, including Cassius Clay.

Frazier is a Philadelphia native. There will be no home television, Taylor said.

CHICAGO (AP)—Former Notre Dame football coach Frank Leahy announced Wednesday a well-financed professional football league will be in operation in 1967 to compete in a signing war with the National Football League and the American Football League.

Leahy, who will serve as chairman of a corporation with the complete power normally accorded a league commissioner, said that the group would be called the United Football League.
